## Campbell Taken Into Waynesville Lions Club

Fred Y. Campbell, civic leader, American Legion official, and sheriff-nominate, is also a Lion now.  
 He was inducted Thursday night into the Waynesville service organization by Joe Davis, chairman of the club's Lions education committee.  
 The vacancy in the 65-member roster was created when the Rev. L. G. Elliott, pastor of the First Baptist Church here, resigned because he is moving to Roxboro this month. He accepted the position of pastor of the First Baptist Church there last month.  
 The new Lion served as the first president of the Soco Gap Boosters Club, created more than a year ago to promote the development of the Soco Valley. He's also been active in the civic affairs of his home town of Hazelwood.

A former commander of the American Legion's Waynesville post (officially, Haywood Post 47), he was elected last spring to serve as commander of the Legion's Western North Carolina district.  
 The posts in the district have a membership of approximately 3,000 veterans.  
 In the May 27 Democratic Primary, he scored a top-sided victory in the three-man race for the nomination for sheriff.
