RALEIGH—The report in Raleigh this week is that John Marshall, private secretary to Governor W. Kerr Scott, is contemplating resigning this position and joining some branch of the armed services within the next few weeks. Marshall, who formerly handled public relations for FCX here and who handled the campaign which led to the \$200,000,000 road program, succeeded Charles Parker as assistant to the Governor a year ago when the latter became head of the State News Bureau. In World War II, Secretary Marshall was in the U. S. Navy.

Ben Rhone, v. Rocky Mount, the other assistant to the Governor and his outer office contact man, is expected to succeed him in the event Marshall decides to become associated with Uncle Sam's fighting forces.
