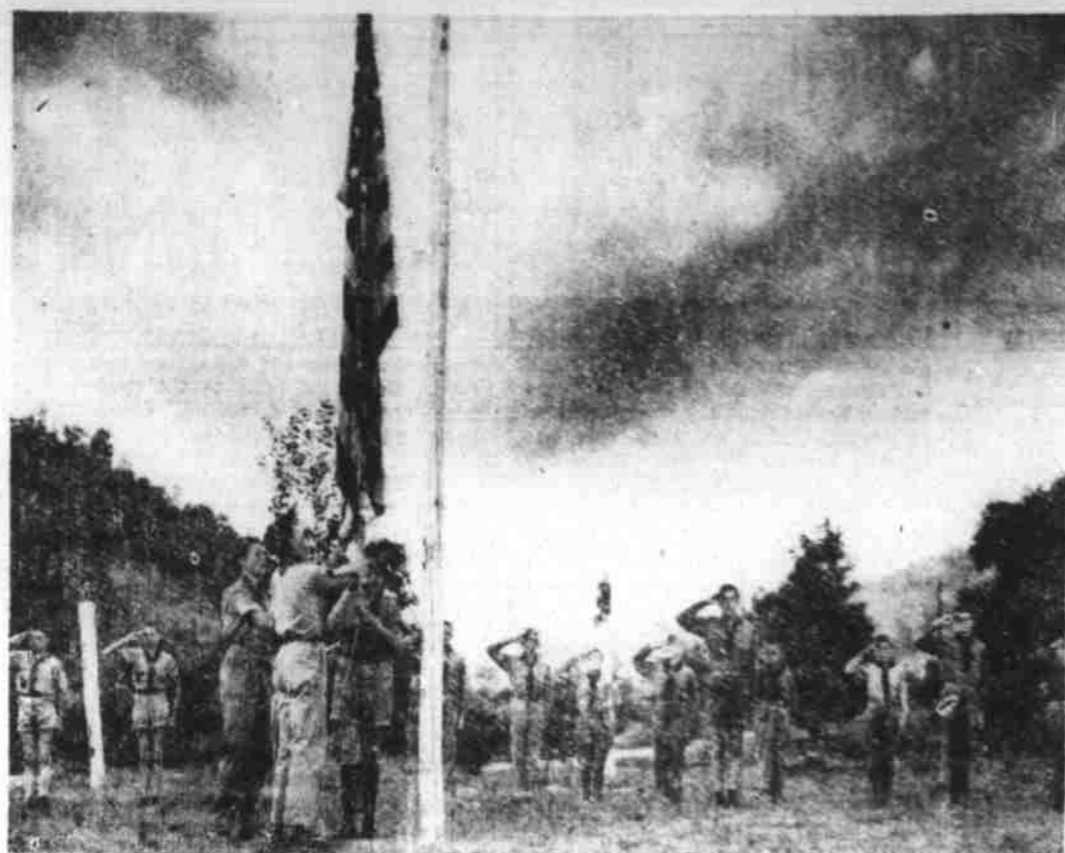


**Check Child's Hearing**

## Last Performance Of Indian Drama On Monday

Five more successive performances, ending Monday September 4 (Labor Day night) will wind up a most successful season for Director Harry Davis' stage interpretation of Kermit Hunter's Indian drama "Unto These Hills," playing at the Mountside Theater at Cherokee. Over 100,000 patrons will have seen the Cherokee Drama at finale-time Labor Day night if some 2,500 reserved and non-reserved seats now available for the final performance are taken. Reserved seats for the other remaining performances this final week are scarce—sold out for Saturday and Sunday nights. Non-reserved seats will be on sale each day, if present indications continue, for the Theatre's some 2,000 seats in that category. Sunday's performance will be dedicated to Jack Frederick Kilpatrick, Cherokee composer of the music for "Unto These Hills." Kilpatrick will arrive Saturday, Sept. 2, to witness and study audience reaction for the last three performances. For the last performance Monday, Labor Day night, traditionally a "swap-parts, try-if-you-think-you-can-do-it-better" occasion, players and production staff members are planning a "super performance even for America's 1950 leading outdoor show."

**Pakistan Cotton**
