The U. S. Civil Service Commission is now accepting applications for the job. The Waynesville Post Office was informed this week.

The work pays \$3,077 a year as a starter. If a man's work is satisfactory, he gets raises every year for the next five years.

After that he becomes eligible to compete for promotions to higher-paying.

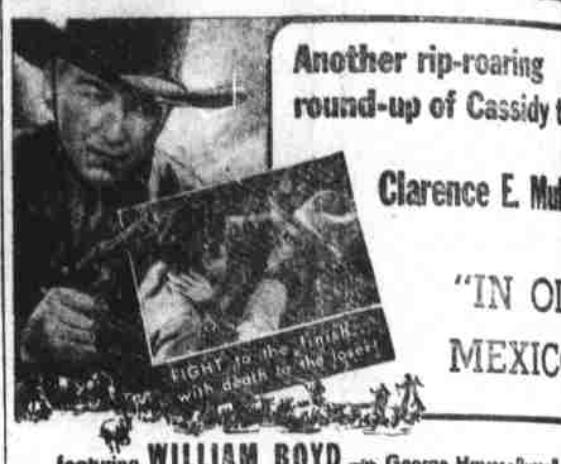
