First Paint Manufacturers

The crude wall paintings of the Cro-Magnon reindeer men in their caves in southern Europe are the first known examples of the use of applied color in a form similar to paint as we know it today. Some authorities say that these paintings were done 25,000 years ago. Others say they are much older. In any case, these wall paintings which are still in existence prove that prehistoric men took reds, browns, yellows — simple earth colors — mixed them with the oils or animal fats and put them to use. These first paint manufacturers, it is believed, painted the forms of the animals they wished to kill on their next hunting expedition.

French-Toasted Sandwiches

Meat, cheese, and peanut butter sandwiches are tasty French-toasted. Dip but don't soak sandwiches in an egg-milk mixture—one egg beaten with two tablespoons of milk is enough for four sandwiches. Brown slowly on both sides in a little hot fat.

For jewelry platinum, hardened with five to ten per cent iridium or five per cent ruthenium or palladium with five per cent ruthenium, is generally employed in the United States. Such tarnish-resistant alloys have very satisfactory mechanical properties, too.

Air-Minded Franklin
Benjamin Franklin was present at many of the trials and experiments with balloons in France. He saw the first ascent of human passengers in a free balloon at the Chateau de la Muette in Paris. The Marquis d'Arlandes and Pilatre de Rozier, the scientist, were raised about 500 feet into the air, during straw, as they went, in a state house underneath the balloon. Their perilous journey took them across the Seine to a safe landing in Paris. That evening the Marquis, together with Montgolfier, called on Franklin. What was said by these adventurous spirits has not been recorded but the next day Franklin wrote to Sir Joseph Banks. "I am sorry his experiment is so totally neglected in England, where mechanical..."

Enemies of Lemming
The most dangerous natural enemies of the lemming are the snowy owl, the arctic fox and ermine, who depend almost exclusively on the lemming as their winter fare. The snowy owl—white except for sharp, black bars across the body—is a born and trained hunter, equipped with ice-pick sharp claws for seizing a victim. Though the owl travels south during a season of lemming migration he rarely breeds outside his home in the arctic circle. The ermine thin and sinuous, is more successful than the fox in hunting down the lemming in the rodent's years of scarcity. The ermine can travel the lemming roads—built in the winter under a heavy blanket of snow—while the fox must smell and search and die for his food.

Keep Wool Clean
Clean wool brings the highest price on the market. W. B. Connell, extension livestock specialist at the Pennsylvania State College, urges sheepmen to shear on a clean, dry surface and to keep all trash out of the fleeces. Shear only when the wool is dry and tie the fleeces with paper twine.
