Parables From The Bible



THE WICKED HUSBANDMEN

(Third of a series of condensations of the parables of Jesus taken from the Bible.)

A certain householder planted a vineyard, hedged it, digged a winepress, built a tower, and let it out to husbandmen, and went into a far country: And when the time of the fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the husbandmen, that they might receive the fruits of it.

And the husbandmen took his servants, and beat one, and killed another, and stoned another.

He sent other servants more than the first: and they did unto them likewise.

But last of all he sent his son, saying, They will reverence my son. But when the husbandmen saw the son, they said among themselves, This is the heir; come, let us kill him, and let us seize on his inheritance.

And they caught him, and cast him out of the vineyard, and slew him.

When the lord thereof vineyard cometh, what will he do unto those husbandmen?

They say unto him, He miserably destroy those men, and will let out his yard unto other husbandmen, which shall render him in their seasons.

Jesus saith, Did ye not read in the scriptures, The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner: this is the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes?

Therefore say I, The kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and given to a nation which shall forth the fruits thereof: and he whosesoever shall fall on this stone shall be broken: but on whomsoever shall fall, it will grind him to powder.

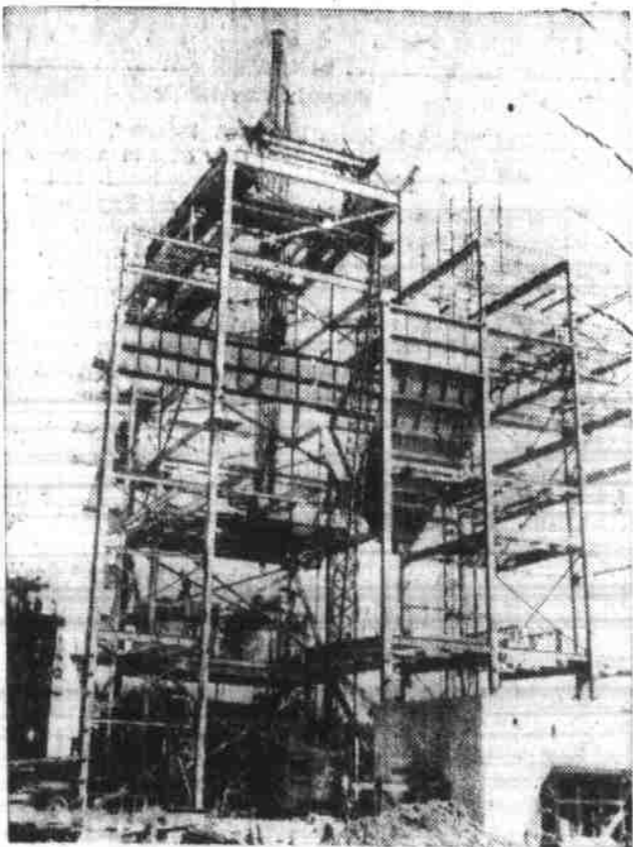

MORE AND MORE POWER FOR SALE



The first of two 100,000 horsepower units will be ready for operation at our Goldsboro Plant by the middle of 1951—the second unit will be ready in the early part of 1952. These two units will be capable of producing over one billion kilowatt hours annually.

The new Lumberton Plant now in operation is capable of producing 750,000,000 kilowatt hours of electricity per year. This capacity will be increased by 525,000,000 kilowatt hours annually when an enlargement to this plant has been completed early in 1952.

To take care of our customers' requirements during the past twelve months, 2½ billion kilowatt hours of electricity were generated into our company's system. We met all demands for power and could have generated more if our customers had wanted more.

Within the next twenty months, three new generating units, now being installed, will be producing power at our Lumberton and Goldsboro plants.

These new units will add 1½ billions of kilowatt hours of electricity per year to our present capacity.

This means an increase of 60 per cent in capacity over and above our present customer requirements.

Our problem will be the development of a market for all this additional 1½ billion kilowatt hours of electricity as it becomes available.
