

The first of two 100,000 horsepower units will be ready for operation at our Goldsboro Plant by the middle of 1951 the second unit will be ready in the early part of 1952. These two units will be capable of producing over one billion kilowatt hours annually,

The new Lumberton Plant now in operation is capable of producing 750,000,000 kilowatt hours of electricity per year. This capacity will be increased by 525,000,000 kilowatt hours annually when an enlargement to this plant has been completed early in 1952.
