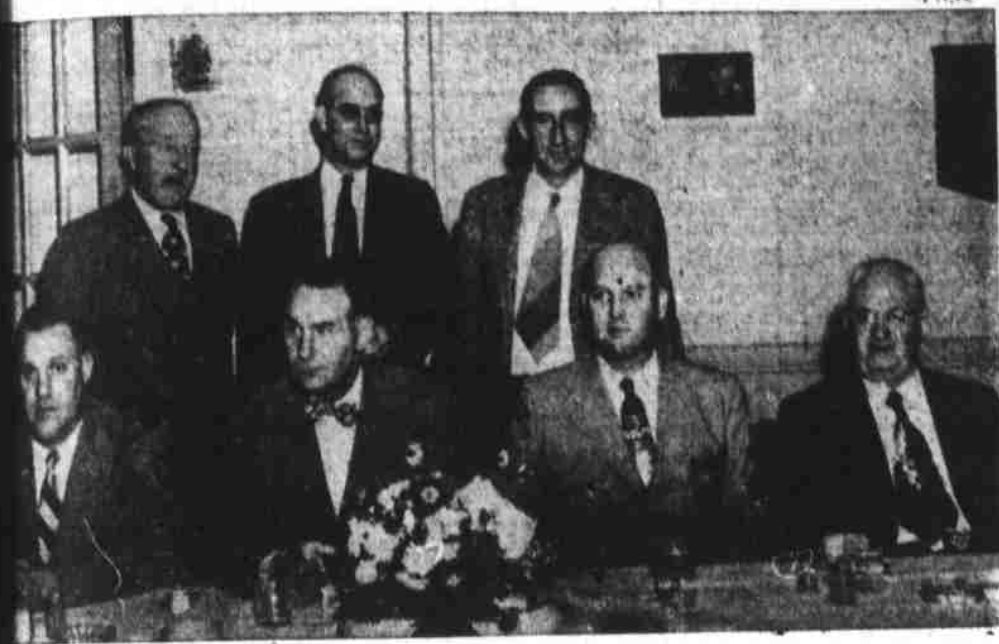


Many Communities Represented At WNCAC Meeting

NOTE — All Former North Ward and Pigeon Books Are Out of Use — You MUST REGISTER.

All persons living in the District which was formerly known as North Ward Waynesville must register again. The polling place for those living in EAST WAYNESVILLE PRECINCT is the East Waynesville School, the Registrar is Harley Francis.

The polling place for those living in CENTER WAYNESVILLE PRECINCT is the COMMISSIONERS ROOM, HAYWOOD COUNTY COURT HOUSE, the Registrar is Mrs. Paul Gough.

The polling place for WEST WAYNESVILLE PRECINCT is Pressley's Store, the Registrar is Johnny J. Ferguson.

All persons living in Pigeon Township must register again. The polling place for

PIGEON PRECINCT is Bethel School, the Registrar is Walker Brown.

The polling place for CENTER PIGEON PRECINCT is Spring Hill School, the Registrar is Mrs. Harley Wells.

All persons living in the Saunook area must register. The polling place is the Saunook School, the Registrar is Mrs. Clifton Shook.

All Registrars in the County will be at the polling place from 9:00 A. M. until 6:00 P. M. on Saturday, the 28th of October, 1950, for purposes of registration. They can also register persons at any time during the week. The last day of registration is Saturday, October 28, 1950.
