Almost 500 Haywood Folk To Get Drivers License Between Now And Jan. 1st

Between 400 and 500 Haywood citizens are supposed to get their drivers license renewed between now and January 1, according to Robert V. Hooper, inspector here.

Besides the drivers whose names start with R, S and T, there are those who are in the A and B division who got their renewed license in 1947. The law requires that each person getting a renewal license have it renewed in four years, within 30 days of its expiration.

Those renewing their license prior to expiration will be spared the road test and some other questioning, Inspector Hooper said. Those coming in late have to take the full examination, including road tests.

Inspector Hooper is here every Monday and Thursday, and also the second, fourth and fifth Tuesdays.
