30-Day Ban Placed On Non-Essential Building

WASHINGTON — The government has imposed a 30-day ban on non-essential construction of hotels, stores, banks, and other commercial buildings to conserve materials for defense.

The National Production Authority announced that, as a general rule, such construction will be permitted only in "emergency cases between now and February 15.

Thereafter, it said, strict curbs will be imposed under which this rule-of-thumb will apply in authorizing new projects:

1. They will help further the defense program.
2. They are essential to public health, welfare or safety.
3. They will alleviate or prevent hardship.

The order, which applies to most construction costing more than \$5,000, is an extension of previous curbs on new buildings for recreation and amusement.

It exempts projects to be constructed for the defense department and the Atomic Energy Commission as well as wholesale food establishments and wholesale supply facilities for fuel oil, gasoline, coal, gas distribution and pipelines.

The order applies to motels and tourist camps as well as to hotels. Also covered are office buildings, barber and beauty shops, garages and service stations, laundry and dry cleaning establishments, restaurants, printing plants, shopping centers and other community and neighborhood buildings, and facilities for the display, distribution or sale of consumer goods.

National Exams For Teachers Set For Feb. 17

PRINCETON, N. J.—The National Teacher Examinations, prepared and administered annually by Educational Testing Service, will be given at testing centers throughout the United States on Saturday, February 17, 1951.

At the one-day testing session a candidate may take the Common Examinations, which include tests in General Culture, Mental Abilities and Basic Skills, and Professional Information; and one or two of nine Optional Examinations, designed to demonstrate mastery of subject matter to be taught. The college which a candidate is attending or the school system in which he is seeking employment will advise him whether he must offer the National Teacher Examinations and which of the tests he should take.

Application forms, and a Bulletin of Information describing registration procedure and containing sample test questions, may be obtained from college officials, school superintendents, or directly from the National Teacher Examination, Education Test Service, P. O. Box 592, Princeton, New Jersey. A completed application, accompanied by the proper examination fee, should reach the ETS office not later than January 19, 1951.
