



ority announced that, as a general rule, such construction will be permitted only in "emergency cases between now and February 15. Thereafter, it said, strict curbs

1. They will help further the defense program.

2. They are essential to public health, welfare or safety. 3. They will alleviate or prevent

For Teachers Set For Feb. 17

PRINCETON, N. J.—The National Teacher Examinations, prepared and administered annually by Educational Testing Service, will be given at testing eenters throughout the United States on Saturday, February 17, 1951.

At the one-day testing session a candidate may take the Common Examinations, which include tests in General Culture, Mental Abilities and Basic Skills, and Professional Information; and one or two of nine Optional Examinations, designed to demonstrate mastery of subject matter to be taught. The college which a candidate is attending or the school system in which he is seeking employment will advise him whether he must offer the National Teacher Examinations and which of the tests he should take.




