Raises Funds For Spring Hill Church
Members of the Spring Hill Baptist Church plan to use the Lord's Acre plan to supplement the financing of their new church. Both group and individual projects are being organized.
First receipt from the program was \$60 from the sale of a calf. Ten persons have reported dedicating calves as individual projects. These calves are to be sold for veal and the proceeds given to the church. One person has dedicated a stand of timber. Two ladies are planning bean patches, and one is dedicating a pig.
Two group projects have been planned thus far. Paul Ledbetter has offered the use of an acre of land, and Earl Clark has offered the use of five acres. These will be planted to corn and potatoes.
Work on the new structure is now in progress. The carpenters are putting up rafters this week, and it is hoped that the roof will be on by the end of the month.

Almost 26,000 Given Drivers License In Feb.
Driver's license examiners of the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles issued a total of 25,970 driver's licenses during February, the Department reported today.
Of the number, 22,663 were operator's licenses issued on new applications, 2,014 were duplicate operator's licenses, and 1,197 were chauffeur's licenses.
Net revenue from issuance of licenses was \$64,523.25, with \$60,935.50 coming from original operator's licenses, \$2,190 from original chauffeur's licenses and \$1,397.75 from duplicate operator's and chauffeur's licenses.
