

sadly, "Couldst thou not watch one hour?" Again Jesus went and prayed, returning to find them asleep again. A third time Jesus prayed and resigned Himself to God's will and when He came to His friends He told them. "Rise up and let us go: lo, he that betrayeth Me is at hand."

Immediately they were surrounded by chief priests and soldiers, and Judas went to His Master and kissed Him-not through love, but to show His enemies that He was the man they sought.

Did the disciples defend Him? Did they go with Him when He was led away? One, indeed, drew a sword and cut off an ear of a servant of the high priest, for which Jesus reproved him. Then all fled but Peter, who followed

his Master at a distance. Jesus was brought before the council of the Sanhedrin, and false witnesses testified against Him, but they didn't agree in their testimony. Jesus own answer to the chief priest condemned Him, for He said He was "the Son of Man" which was considered blas-

phemy. Someone recognized Peter as a companion of Jesus, but he denied it three times, only to hear a cock crow twice. Realizing that he had done what Jesus had foretold, Peter went away weeping.
