No. 2—The Van Wells chicken house—so large that all of it cannot be shown in one picture. This

house holds 6,000 chickens. The truck at the rear was hauling in new shavings, while the truck just beyond the tree was loading with chickens when this picture was made. Mr. Wells has four broods a year, of 6,000 each, or 24,000 chickens are raised in this one house each year. The 9-week-old pul-

lets are put out on farms as layers of hatchable eggs.

No. 3—A scene in East Pigeon, looking east on the Sherman Williams cove. Miss Mildred Pinn on the right. The Thomas Michael home (see picture No. 2, page one) is in the center of the picture, slightly towards the left.
