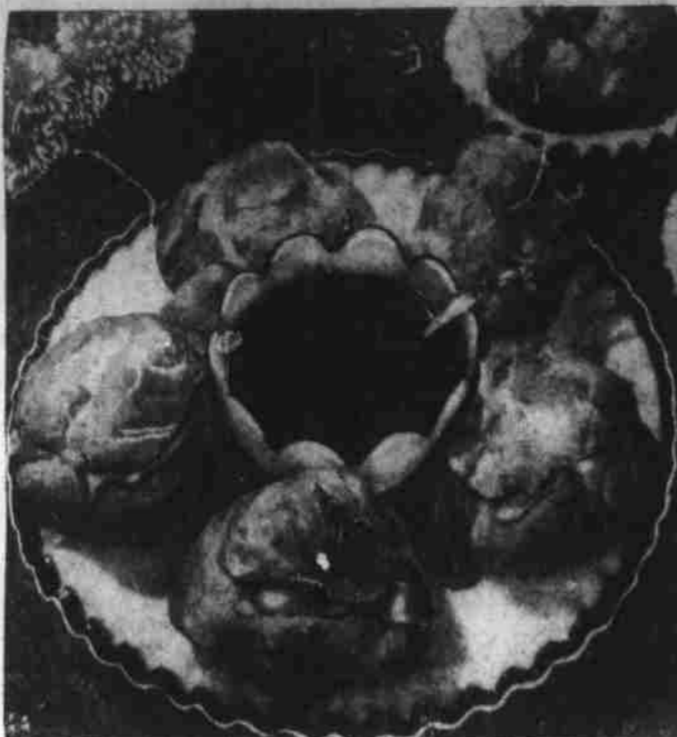
Softball coaches for both men's and women's teams were chosen. Mrs. Teague Williams was named coach for the women, and Brown Messer for the men.

Coffee Flavors Luscious Desserts

When you want to prepare a luscious coffee dessert that the whole family can enjoy, use caffeine-free coffee. Coffee of this type now comes in instant form, so you can have it ready in a jiffy. And smooth and comes away from the sides of pan. Remove from heat. Add 4 eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition until mixture is smooth. Drop about 2 inches apart on greased baking sheet. Bake in very hot (450° F.) oven for 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 400

degrees and bake about 25 minutes longer.

Ingredients: One 3 1/4-ounce package prepared vanilla pudding, 1 tablespoon instant caffeine-free coffee, 1/2 cups milk, 1/2 cup cream, 12 large cream puffs.

Method: Mix vanilla pudding and instant caffeine-free coffee in saucepan. Add milk gradually, blending well. Cook over moderate heat, stirring constantly, until mixture comes to a boil and thickens. Cool, stirring occasionally. Whip cream and fold in. Fill cream puffs and serve with Special Coffee Sauce.

SPECIAL COFFEE SAUCE

Ingredients: 2 tablespoons instant caffeine-free coffee, 1 tablespoon flour, dash of salt, 1 cup light corn syrup, 3/4 cup light cream, 2 tablespoons butter.

Method: Mix coffee, flour, and salt in saucepan. Add corn syrup gradually, stirring constantly. Add cream and butter; simmer 5 minutes or until thickened, stirring constantly. Cool. Serve over cream puffs.
