## Sunday School Lesson

### The Southern Kingdom

RECORDING THE REIGN OF GOOD KING HEZEKIAH

Scripture—II Kings 18-20; II Chronicles 29-30; Isaiah 31.

HOW IT came to pass in the year of Hoshea, son of Eliah, of Israel, that Hezekiah the Ahaz king of Judah began to reign, and five years old was he when he began to reign in Jerusalem. He reigned 29 years. Apparently following his own convictions, this young king went to work to bring his people back to the worship of the Lord. He "removed the high places and brake the pillars;" he "dethroned the idols and broke the altars;" he "cut off the incense before it, and wrought a revival. He told the Levites, priests to cleanse the temple and sanctify themselves. Then sent messengers into all the land and into Israel, asking the people to come to Jerusalem for the Passover.

He even "cut off the gold from the doors of the temple of the Lord, and from the pillars" which he himself had overlaid, and gave all to the king of Assyria.

However, Sennacherib was still not satisfied. He wanted to take Jerusalem and destroy it. He sent a great army to the city. Rabshakeh, one of the leaders of the Assyrian army, called to the king, who sent three messengers to hear what the Assyrians had to say.

Rabshakeh told them to tell Hezekiah that there was no use in trusting to Jehovah to help them in this predicament; other gods had not helped their people. Also, that if they were depending on Egypt for aid, it would do them no good.

Hezekiah's messengers returned to the king with their clothes rent in despair. The king also rent his clothes and covering himself in sackcloth, he went to the house of the Lord. Then he sent messengers dressed in sackcloth to Isaiah, the prophet, to ask what they should do.

Isaiah told them to tell the king that the Lord said that the Assyrian had blasphemed, and that He would "send a blast upon him, and he shall hear a rumour, and shall return to his own land; and I will cause him to fall by the sword in his own land."

Again Rabshakeh threatened and warned Hezekiah not to trust in his God. However, Hezekiah

prayed to the Lord, and "he came to pass that night, that the angel of the Lord went out, and smote off the Assyrians in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred and fourscore and five thousand; and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses."

Thus did the Lord rebuke the Assyrians who had blasphemed Him. Sennacherib was killed in his own camp. We next read that King Hezekiah was "sick unto death."

He told him to prepare to die. Hezekiah, however, prayed to the Lord. He reminded Him that he (Hezekiah) had turned Judah's people to Him after years of faithlessness; that he had done good in the Lord's sight. His prayer was answered, and he recovered and reigned for another 15 years.

So the Lord rewarded His faithful servant. As Hezekiah said to Isaiah, "Good is the word of the Lord which thou hast spoken, and he said, Is it not good, if peace and truth be in my days?"
