Famous Evangelistic Singer Heard At Rotary

Homer Radebeaver, nationally famous evangelistic singer, was the speaker at Rotary here Friday, when he outlined his plans for "Rainbow Ranch for Boys" at Panama, Fla.

Mr. Radebeaver is gathering in the Candler Camp Meeting at Lake Junaluska, and explained the purpose of the ranch was to provide a home for underprivileged boys. He has dedicated 320 acres of land bordering the St. John's river for the project.

He cited the national record, as furnished in an interview with Edgar J. Hoover, chief of the FBI, and said, "All courts and agencies

realize an ever greater need than organizations can provide. Where necessary, a home will remove the incentive for crime. That is the purpose of Rainbow Ranch."

Mr. Radebeaver mixed his talk with numerous humorous stories. He touched briefly on the life of Billy Sunday, and on Sunday evening at Lake Junaluska, will tell the famous "Billy Sunday Story".
