Clyde Baptist Church Marks 87th Anniversary At Homecoming Sunday

Cowan To Preach At Hazelwood And Bethel Sun.

The Rev. L. F. Cowan, of Stanfield, near Charlotte, has been invited by the Hazelwood and Bethel Presbyterian Church Pulpit Committees to visit the field and preach Sunday. Mr. Cowan is a member of Mecklenburg Presbyterian and is a graduate of Davidson College and of Union Theological Seminary, Richmond, Va. He is married and has three children.

The Pulpit Committees of the two churches are responsible for nominating to the congregations a pastor to succeed the Rev. Paul P. Thrower, who has resigned in order to accept a call to the Presbyterian Church of Pickens, S. C.

The Hazelwood committee is composed of L. N. Davis, chairman, a new elder in the church; E. W. Greene, a deacon; William Green, Jr., a layman; and Miss Edith Summerrow, president, of the Women of the Church.

The Bethel committee is composed of Clifton S. Terrell, chairman and Elder; Henry Justice, Deacon; and Mrs. Wiley Medford, a member of the Women of the Church.

The Clyde Baptist Church will celebrate its eighty-seventh anniversary next Sunday with the observance of its Third Annual Homecoming Day. Dr. Robert L. Holt, head of the Department of Religion at Eastern Carolina Teachers College, will deliver the sermon at both the morning and evening services.

Among the features of the day will be the annual roll call of families in the church by Grover C. Haynes, chairman of the Board of Deacons. This will be done at the opening exercise of the Sunday School.

Following the morning service a picnic will be served under the oaks on the church grounds.
