The secret behind the bat's mysterious ability to fly in the dark is now being revealed in the religious-science film, "Dust or Destiny," produced by Moody Institute of Science, to be shown at the Haywood County Methodist Youth Fellowship, next Monday at 7:30 p. m., according to the Rev. P. H. Duckwall. The meeting will be held at the Morning Star Methodist Church.

Only recently did scientists discover that bats are equipped with their own "radar" to steer them in their midnight flights. In "Dust or Destiny," the story of this radar has been captured in motion pictures and sound for the first time.

In flight, bats make continual sharp cries, of such high frequency that they are inaudible to the human ear. According to the film, these cries are the key to their "radar," for the furry little creatures are guided by echoes of their signal cries reflected from obstacles in their path.
