The Rev. George A. Hudson, Th.D., long-time missionary to China, will be the guest preacher at the Presbyterian Church in Waynesville Sunday morning. His subject will be "Communism in China and its Challenge to the Christian Church."

Mr. Hudson has been back in the States for a year after having lived under Communist rule in China for one year. During his 29 years in missionary work in China he has lived and worked under four Chinese governments — the Manchurian puppet regime and the Communist government.

The son of missionary parents, Mr. Hudson was born in Szechuan, China. He is a graduate of Davidson College and of Columbia Seminary, and studied at Union Theological Seminary.

The public is invited to hear this timely message from a man who knows China and knows what it is to live behind the Iron Curtain.
