Dr. Bowen is also vice chairman of the commission on general Christian education of the National Council of Churches.

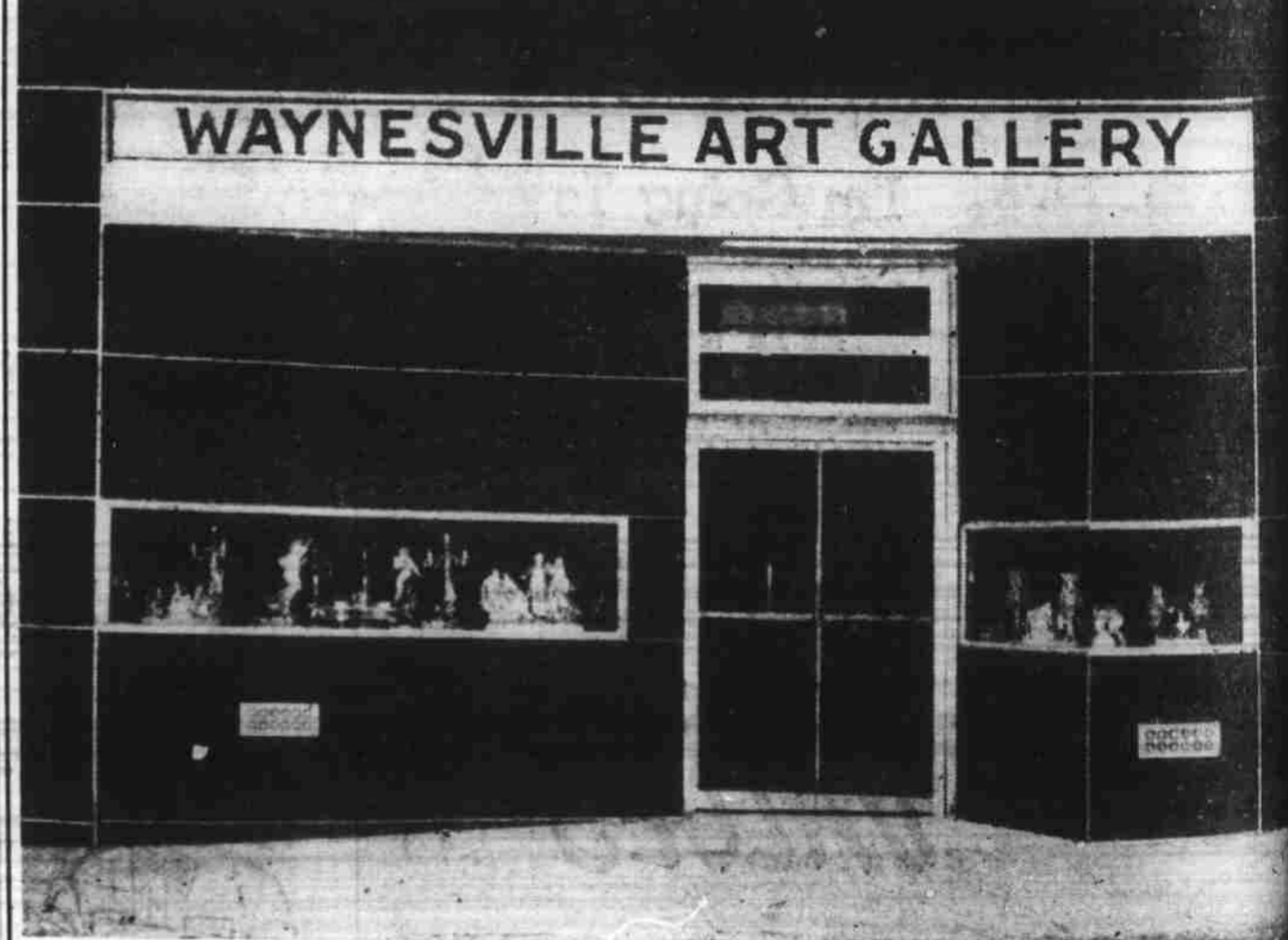
His counsel on the production and use of motion pictures, slides, film strips and transcription is available to the 400 church workers enrolled as well as to all ministers.
