Music Week Features August Assembly Plans

Fifteen conferences and special events scheduled for August at this Southeastern Methodist Assembly will be highlighted by Music Week, August 20-26, and the traditional coronation of Queen Junaluska, August 18.

Half of these are individual or one day events, while the others are regular conference programs lasting several days to two weeks each. The schedule includes sessions twice daily at the circular Junaluska Auditorium at 11 a.m. and 8 p.m. for tourists and residents of the area, as well as for delegates.

Under the leadership of Cyrus

Daniel, F.A.G.O., director of music for the Assembly, courses are to be offered during Music Week to meet the needs of church choir leaders, organists, singers, ministers, and interested laymen. Dr. Carl F. Mueller, organist and music director, Presbyterian Church, and director of music in the public schools, Montclair, N. J.; and Dr. Roberta Bitgood, director of music, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Buffalo, N. Y., who specializes in junior choir work, will be guest faculty members.

The daily schedule offers lessons in choral repertory and technique by Dr. Mueller at 9 a.m.; organ repertory and problems by Mr. Daniel at 10 a.m.; Sunday School music and song leadership under Dr. Bitgood, at 11 a.m.; junior choir clinic from 2:30 to 4 p.m. directed by Dr. Bitgood, and Festival Chorus rehearsal conducted by Dr. Mueller from 4 to 5:30 p.m.

Evening programs will include an oratoric night, solo recital, and a hymn festival. Social events planned include auto trip to points of scenic interest, music week party, and boatrides on the lake. Inquiries concerning Music Week registration and accommodations may be addressed to Cyrus Daniel, director of Music.

Saturday, August 4. Senator Spessard L. Holland, former governor of Florida, member of the U. S. Committee on Public Works, Emory University trustee and a Methodist layman, will deliver the Emory University Day address at 11 a.m. At the 8 o'clock hour, Bob Brown's famous Science circus, designed to interest and to entertain, will be given.

Sunday, August 5. Bishop Paul N. Garber, presently serving in the Richmond Area, but whose previous European Episcopal Area includes nations now behind the Iron Curtain, will speak at the morning and evening services.

Dr. W. B. Davies, exchange professor at Duke University, will be heard the morning of August 11. Duke University Night will be observed at the evening service.

August 12 is Junaluska Sunday with Bishop Clare Purcell, Birmingham Area, delivering the morning sermon and Dr. Davies the evening address. This is an annual event when summer visitors are given an opportunity to contribute to the expansion program of this church center.

Monday, August 20. Dr. Albert Dale Hagler, pastor, Bryan Memorial Methodist Church, Miami, Fla., since 1935 will speak at 11 a.m. and 8 p.m. Dr. Hagler is an author and leader in the field of combining psychology with Christian teachings to effect the solution of difficult personal problems.

The General Board of Education of the Methodist Church will conduct two conferences at Shackford Hall during August: the Leadership School July 30 - August 10, a Bible and Christian Education Conference, August 6-9.

The two-day meeting for secretaries, treasurers and statisticians of the 17 Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church in the nine Southeastern states is scheduled for August 2-3. Sessions are to be held in the auditorium chapel with Dr. E. H. Nease, Charlotte, as president and Dr. Don C. Cooks, Miami, Fla., as secretary.

Delegates to the Southeastern Jurisdictional Historical Society of the Methodist Church will register at Lambuth Inn, Saturday, August 4. Bishop Garber is their August 5 speaker. They will have their business meeting at 11 a.m., August 6, in the auditorium chapel. Chaplain and Mrs. W. N. Thomas, local residents, will be host and hostess from 3 to 5 p.m. at a tea and exhibit at Lambuth Inn, August 6. Dr. Edgar H. Nease, Charlotte, is president of the Society; Bishop Garber, vice president; Dr. J. Manning Potts, Nashville, secretary; and Rev. George B. Ehlhardt, Brevard, associate secretary.

The Rev. Prof. J. Pitt-Watson, Trinity College, Glasgow, Scotland, will be the principal speaker at morning and evening services during Preaching Week, August 13-19. Dr. Pitt-Watson has been active in ecumenical church affairs, as well as in the field of education, as is evidenced by his service as a delegate to the First General Assembly of the World Council of Churches at Amsterdam in 1948.

August 20-24, Bishop Paul B. Kern of the Nashville Area, will present a series of Bible lectures at 9:30 each morning, in the beautiful Memorial Chapel. During his 20 years as Bishop, he has gained a reputation for deep, clear thinking presented in an easy-to-understand manner.

The Radio and Film Workshop previously scheduled for August 27-29 has been cancelled.

Coronation of the Queen of Junaluska is a traditional event which brings together the Junaluska family in a happy, gala occa-

sion. Individuals, young and old, the hotels and business houses recognize the event as one of interest and importance. The event, preceded several days by election of the Queen, is marked by stately and dignified pageantry.

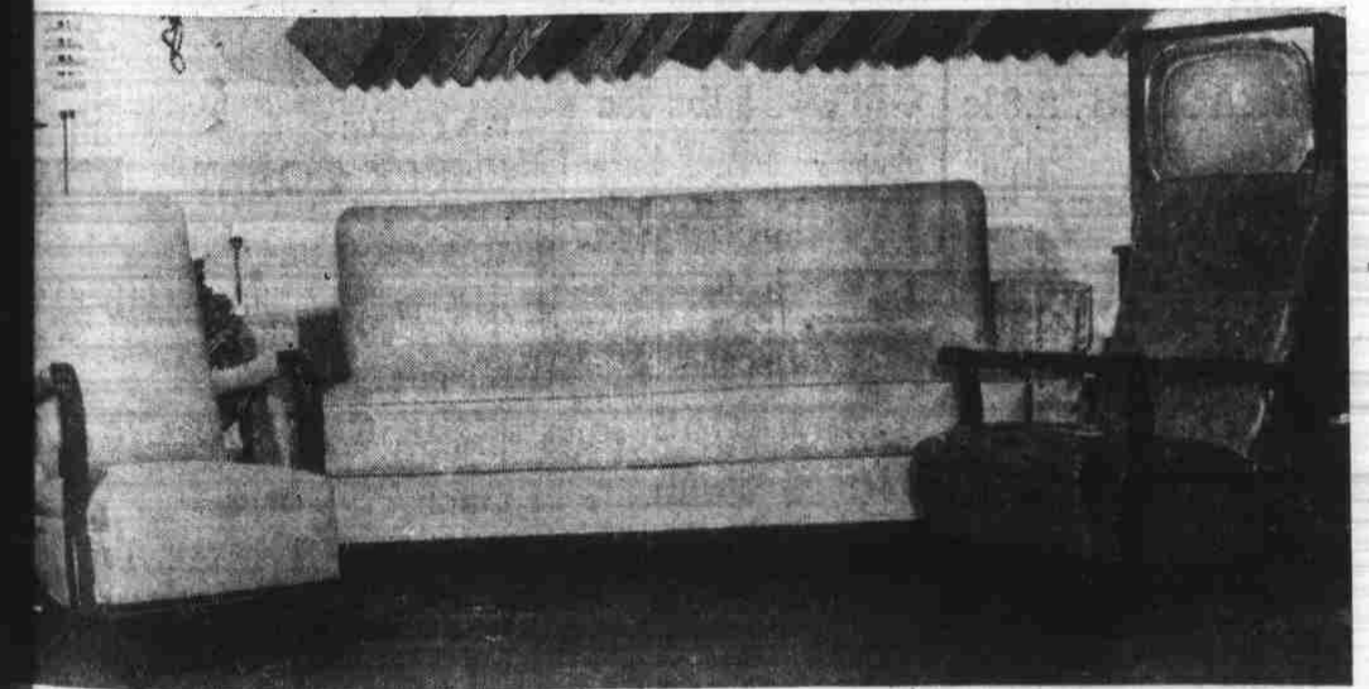

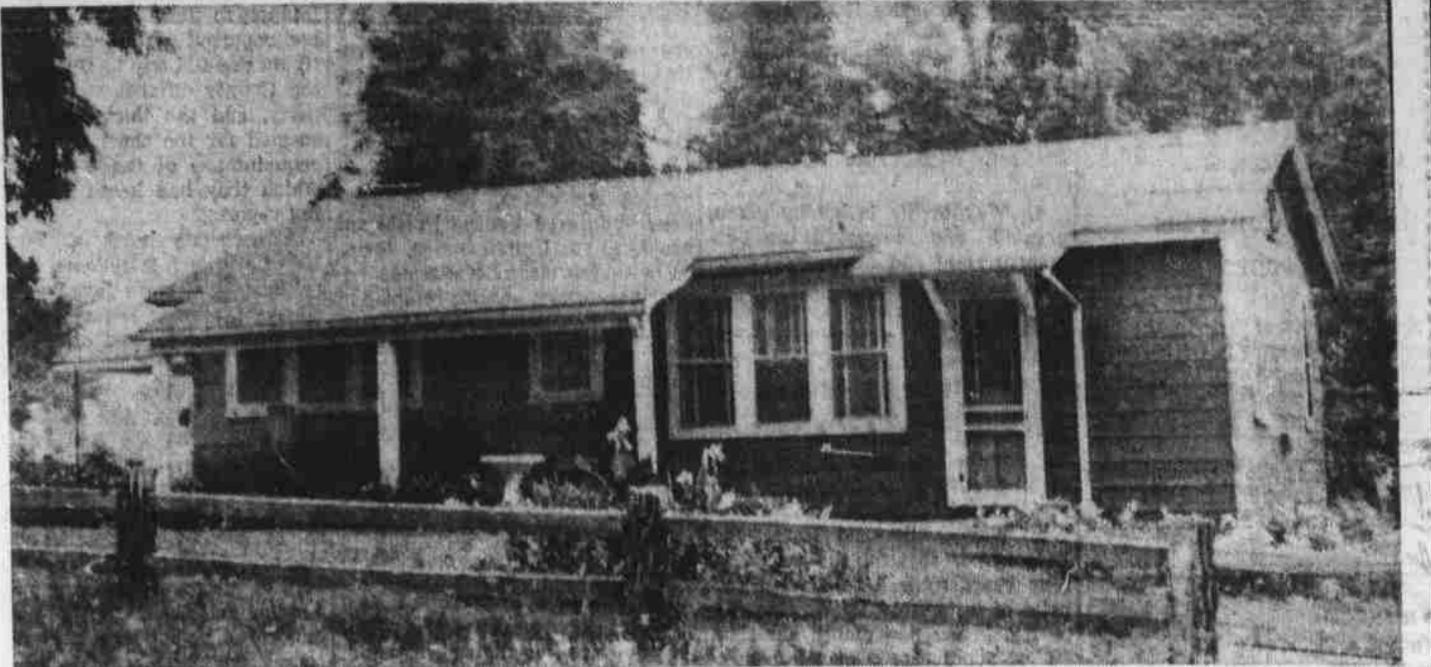
