Clyde Church Observes 87th Anniversary

An interesting talk was given by Mrs. Eugene Wilkins of Long Beach, Calif. Her husband was pastor of the church from 1897 to 1903, at which time it was still known as Pleasant Hill Baptist Church. Gross observed later that while at present there are no colored members, there are no restrictions upon their joining if they should so desire.

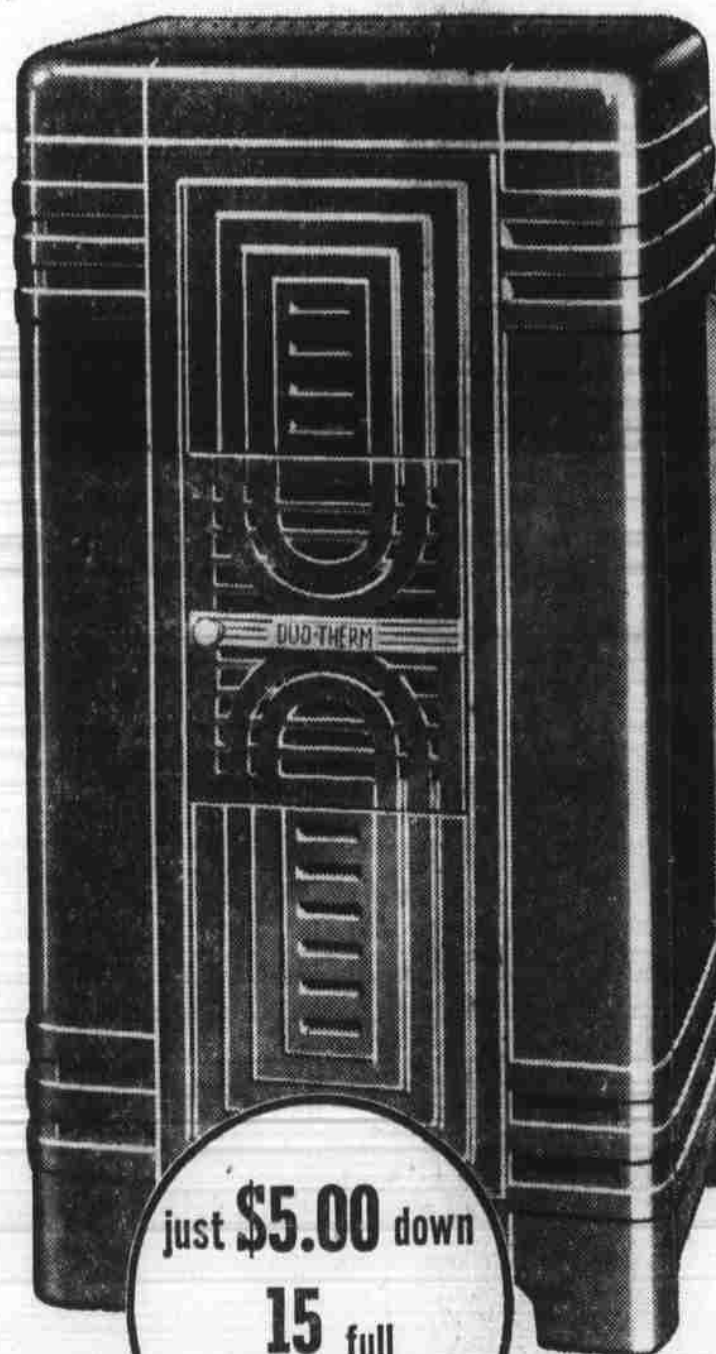
