Noted Speakers Will Be Heard At Junaluska On Christian Education

"The heart of Christian education is experiencing the Bible as we use it," a noted church literature editor told delegates to a South-wide conference on Christian education this morning at the Lake Junaluska Methodist Assembly.

"A Bible Christian is inspired, saturated and dominated by the spirit and message of the Bible," said the Rev. C. A. Bowen, Nashville, Tenn. He is editor of Methodist Church School publications, and vice chairman of the commission on general Christian education of the National Council of Churches.

The first of eight platform speakers this week on the conference agenda, Dr. Bowen spoke at 11 o'clock in the assembly auditorium. Bishop Costen J. Harrell, Charlotte, will address the conference at 8 p. m. on "The Bible and Christian Education."

The twice-daily Bible Hour is a feature of the conference being held in conjunction with the leadership training school, which opened July 30 and will continue through Friday. Director of both programs is the Rev. M. Earl Cunningham, director of leadership education at the Methodist General Board of Education in Nashville.

Tuesday's speakers will be Miss Mary Alice Jones, Nashville, at 11 a. m. on "How Much Bible Can Children Understand?" and Bishop John Wesley Lord, Boston, Mass., at 8 p. m. on "The Family in a Chaotic World."

Miss Jones, who holds a Ph. D. degree from Yale University, recently joined the Methodist Board of Education as director of children's work. Previously, she was children's book editor for Rand, McNally & Co. Bishop Lord presides over Methodism's New England episcopal area. He held pastorate in his native New Jersey prior to his election as a bishop in 1948.

The platform speakers Wednesday will be Dr. Edward D. Staples, Nashville, at 11 a. m. and Dr. Waights G. Henry, Jr., president of LaGrange College, LaGrange, Ga., at 8 p. m.
