South-Wide Institute Of Music Starts At Lake

Waynesville Gets Boost From Miami Professor

Illustrated Lecture Well Attended And Well Received

More than 500 people attended the illustrated lecture given Monday night in the courthouse by Park Naturalist, Arthur Stupka, of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

The talk, titled "Along Great Smokies Trails," took the enthralled audience off the highways of the park and, by means of kodachrome slides, showed them sights seldom seen by the average tourist. Indeed it was estimated that should a person, in good physical condition, devote an entire summer to the job, he would still not have time to cover half the ground or see half the scenes shown in the 1 1/2 hour lecture.

Mr. Stupka, who has served as Naturalist for the Park for 16 years, was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. It is hoped that he can return next year with another lecture and still more spectacular views of the Great Smokies and its flora and fauna.

The letter added: "The beauty, interest, and friendliness of Waynesville convinced us that here was something atune to our souls in which we wished to share and become a part."
