Members of the early church shared all things in common. Jesus, having laid, sold it, and laid the money at the apostles' feet for the needs of all.

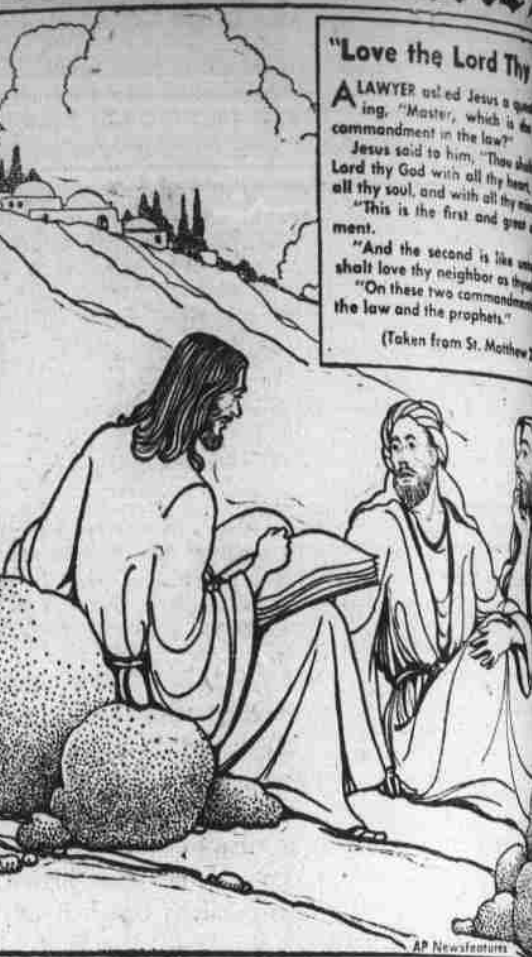
