

Green Pastures Campaign End Saturday; County Enter State Contest

Green Pastures Campaign for which is being sponsored in Haywood County by the Community Development Program, is ending Saturday, September 29. All the Community Chairmen have been asked to submit to the county agent's office a list of their community who are eligible for a Certificate of Achievement or a Green Pastures award.

(a) Green Pastures Award—This award will go to farmers who have one acre of Ladino clover and orchard grass or Fescue and one acre of White clover and bluegrass pasture per animal unit (or 1 1/2 acres of Ladino clover and orchard grass or Fescue pasture per animal unit).

The community winning the highest number of points (Certificates of Achievement count one point and Green Pastures Plaques two points) will receive \$100 cash prize.

All these reports must be turned in to the county agent's office by Saturday, September 29, to be able to qualify in this contest and the state contest for the ten top counties.

The different agricultural agencies in Haywood County are cooperating with the Community Development Organization in putting this program across.
