**Steel, Iron Seek Bottom**

A solid piece of steel or iron would sink to the bottom even where the ocean has the greatest depth. There is a slight compression of the water at great depth but, practically, the density remains the same as near the surface. A body will float only if its average density is less than that of the liquid in which it is placed. The average density of an object is equal to its total weight divided by the total bulk, and that of the solid steel is several times as much as ocean water.
