National Forest Big Game Hunts Scheduled In Hills

The annual hunting season for bear, deer, and Russian wild boar in Western North Carolina's mountains will open November 19 with hundreds of hunters participating according to applications already filed with the Wildlife Resources Commission.

There will be 47 hunts this year—sponsored jointly by the U. S. Forest Service and the Wildlife Resources Commission—and the deadline for filing participation applications was September 22. However, there are several vacancies still open for participation in one or two of the hunts and interested persons should make application immediately with the Wildlife Resources Commission, Raleigh.

Four of the events will be wilderness hunts held on the Pisgah National Forest Game Preserves in the Big Creek, lower and upper Cantrell Creek, and Pisgah Ledge areas. These hunts have been arranged for persons desiring to participate under primitive conditions and who enjoy outdoor camping life with plenty of exercise. Open air grates and fuel wood for cooking are provided and the hunter must bring his own tent, stove, blankets, cooking equipment, food and other miscellaneous necessities. These are strictly "stag" parties, with the women being allowed to participate in all other hunts.

On other hunts the participants must provide their own transportation to and from their assigned checking stations. On the four Main Hunts on Pisgah, camp grounds will be available if desired and on the three Pisgah Ledge hunts the hunters may camp at Stony Fork Guard Station for the 3-day hunt periods or they may check in and out each day.

Two of the hunts are for bow and arrow enthusiasts and will be held on the Bent Creek drainage area of Pisgah Forest on November 19, 20, 21 and November 26, 27, and 28. The bows used on these hunts must have a minimum pull of 45 pounds and arrows are to be barbless, broad head or bodkin. No poison or explosive arrows will be permitted.

Dates and places for the hunts are as follows:

- Pisgah Game Preserve, main hunt (northern section)—Nov. 22, 23, 24; Nov. 29, 30, and Dec. 1; and Dec. 6, 7, 8.
- Bent Creek Bow and Arrow—Nov. 19, 20, 21; Nov. 26, 27, 28.
- Main Hunt, southern section—Nov. 19, 20, 21; Nov. 26, 27, 28, and Dec. 3, 4, 5.
- Big Creek (wilderness)—Nov. 19, 20, 21; Nov. 26, 27, 28, and Dec. 3, 4, 5.
- Upper Cantrell Creek (wilderness)—Nov. 19, 20, 21; Nov. 26, 27, 28; and Dec. 3, 4, 5.
- Cantrell Creek, lower (wilderness)—Nov. 22, 23, 24; Nov. 29, 30, and Dec. 1; and Dec. 6, 7, and 8.
- Pisgah Ledge (wilderness)—Nov. 22, 23, 24; Nov. 29, 30, and Dec. 1; Dec. 6, 7, 8.
- Sherwood, West Fork—Nov. 19, 20, 21; and Nov. 26, 27, and 28.
- Sherwood, Big East Fork—Nov. 22, 23, 24; and Nov. 29, 30, and Dec. 1.
- Mount Mitchell, South Toe—Nov. 19, 20; Nov. 21, 22, and Dec. 6, 7.
- Daniel Boone, Fox Camp—Nov. 19, 20; Nov. 21, 22; and Dec. 6, 7.

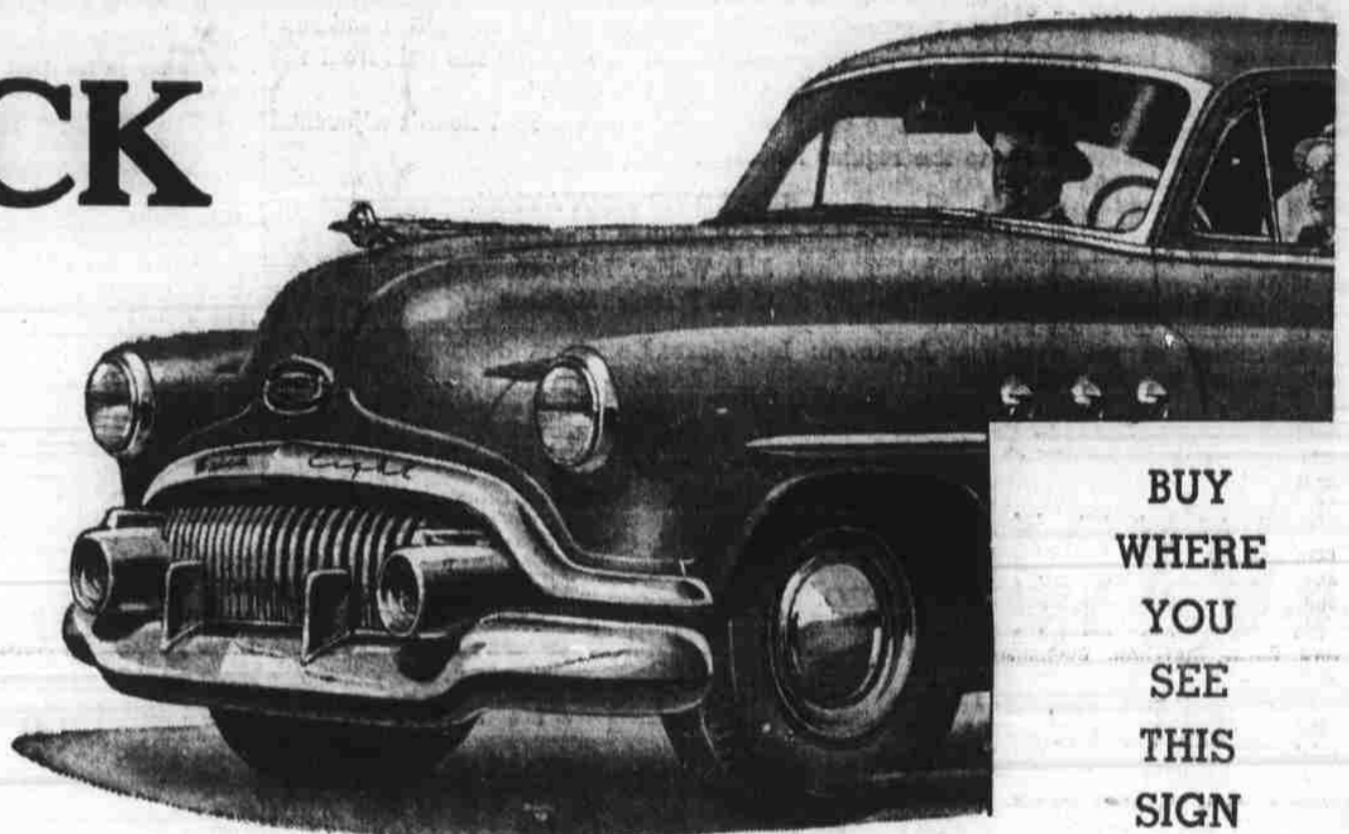
