BANANA CREAM PIE

1/2 cup sugar
Pinch salt
2 tablespoons cornstarch
1 tablespoon flour
2 cups milk

2 egg yolks
1 tablespoon butter
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup sliced bananas
Baked pie shell

Mix sugar, salt, cornstarch, and flour in top of double boiler. Add milk and blend together. Cook over boiling water, stirring constantly until thick and smooth. Cover and cook for five minutes. Blend a small amount of hot mixture into the egg yolks, then blend with remaining hot mixture. Cook over boiling water two minutes, stirring constantly.

Add butter. Remove from heat, add vanilla, and cool. Stir in bananas and pour into baked pie shell. Top with whipped cream or meringue.
