The Haywood County Chorus will hold its final meeting of the year in the Waynesville High School music building Thursday, April 30, at 7:30 p. m.

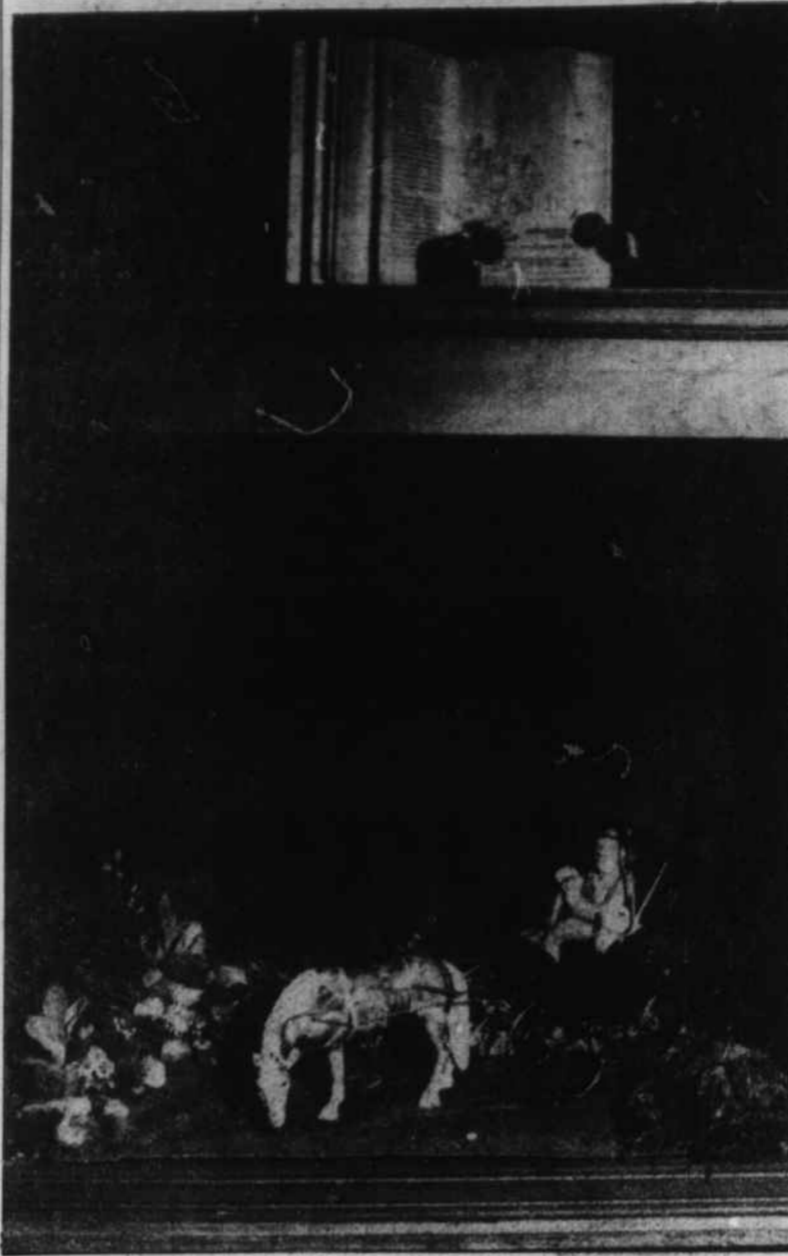
This will also be the final practice prior to the concert to be presented by the Chorus at Camp Schaub Saturday night.
