

# Wild Bill Elliott Coming In Exciting Screenplay

Wild Bill Elliott's latest starring production for Allied Artists, "The Maverick," with Myron Healey and Phyllis Coates in top supporting roles, will be the next feature attraction at the Strand theatre, opening on Wednesday. In this one Elliott plays the part of a lieutenant in the United States cavalry, assigned to lead a small troupe of mounted soldiers against a gang of gunmen, hired by ruthless cattle barons to drive the homesteaders from the range country.

the timers, and goes about her other business without worrying about the eggs.

New X-ray equipment has been added to the department, and in addition to this, the cystoscopic room has its own X-ray machine. I believe that the number (eight) of the operating rooms and the up-to-date equipment will impress the visitors about as much as anything in the hospital.

It would be practically impossible for the changes that have been made without adding to the medical staff. Dr. Alan R. Brown, a roentgenologist, is in charge of the expanded X-ray department, and Dr. Sims S. Hindman heads the pathology department, which did not exist at all in the old hospital.

The hospital should indeed give the people of Haywood County a feeling of satisfaction. Except for the larger units in some of the State's leading cities, Haywood's medical center places the county on a par with any in North Carolina.

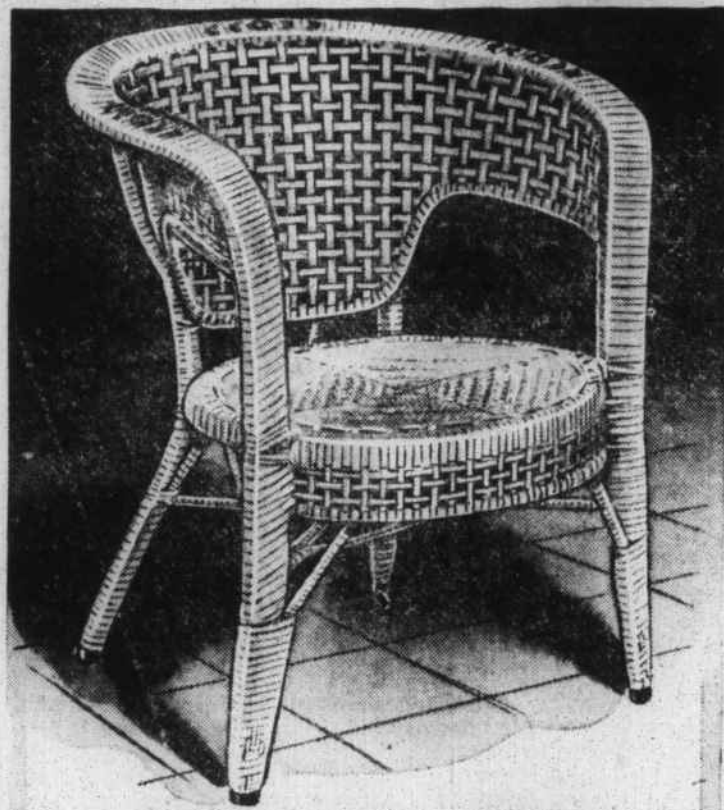
### First Class in Riverside military organization.
