Air Search For Uranium

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP)—Search for uranium in Arizona is being aided by an air survey of prospective uranium fields. The survey is being made by light aircraft equipped with devices which detect radiation as high as 100 feet.

Already nearly 3,000 sq. miles of Coconino County in Arizona have been surveyed and mapped. The map is being dated on the 15th of June. The work is being done by geologists of the Atomic Energy Commission.
