11/4 cups egg whites

11/4 teaspoons cream of tar-1 teaspoon vanilla

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 .teaspoon almond extract Sift flour once, measure, add 1/2 cup sugar; sift four times. Beat egg whites and salt with rotary egg beater or flat wire whisk. When foamy, add cream of tartar; continue beating until eggs are stiff enough to hold in peaks, but not dry.
