Many columnists had deserted Yankee Stadium. For want of what they felt would be a more exciting event, they traveled to Belmont Park and saw Guillotine win the \$112,285 Futurity. They didn't believe the Yankees had a chance, especially since Boston Manager Joe McCarthy was tossing his 25-game ace, Mel Parnell, at Casey Stengel's battered crew.

Yet, there were 69,551 fans in the Stadium, including 700 who eame down from New Haven by rail on the Joe DiMaggio Special to honor the Yankee clutch player. It was Joe DiMaggio Day.
