Donald M. Crawford, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam B. Crawford of Waynesville, Route 4, received his honorable discharge last Sunday at Camp Lejeune.

Donald entered service in August, 1951, when he was sent to Paris Island, S. C. for boot training and was awarded the certificate as the outstanding marksman of his platoon. He later received the rank of Pfc. and three months later was sent to Camp Pendleton, Calif. for two months' combat training. After this training he was sent to Korea where he served three months on the front lines until wounded. He was then sent to the U. S. Naval Hospital in Yokosuka, Japan, where he received treatment for a month and later was sent to Ooska, Japan, where he became top pitcher of the baseball league made up of Americans.

Donald was a graduate of the Crabtree-Iron Duff school, and was an employee of the Farmers Federation before induction into the Marine Corps.
