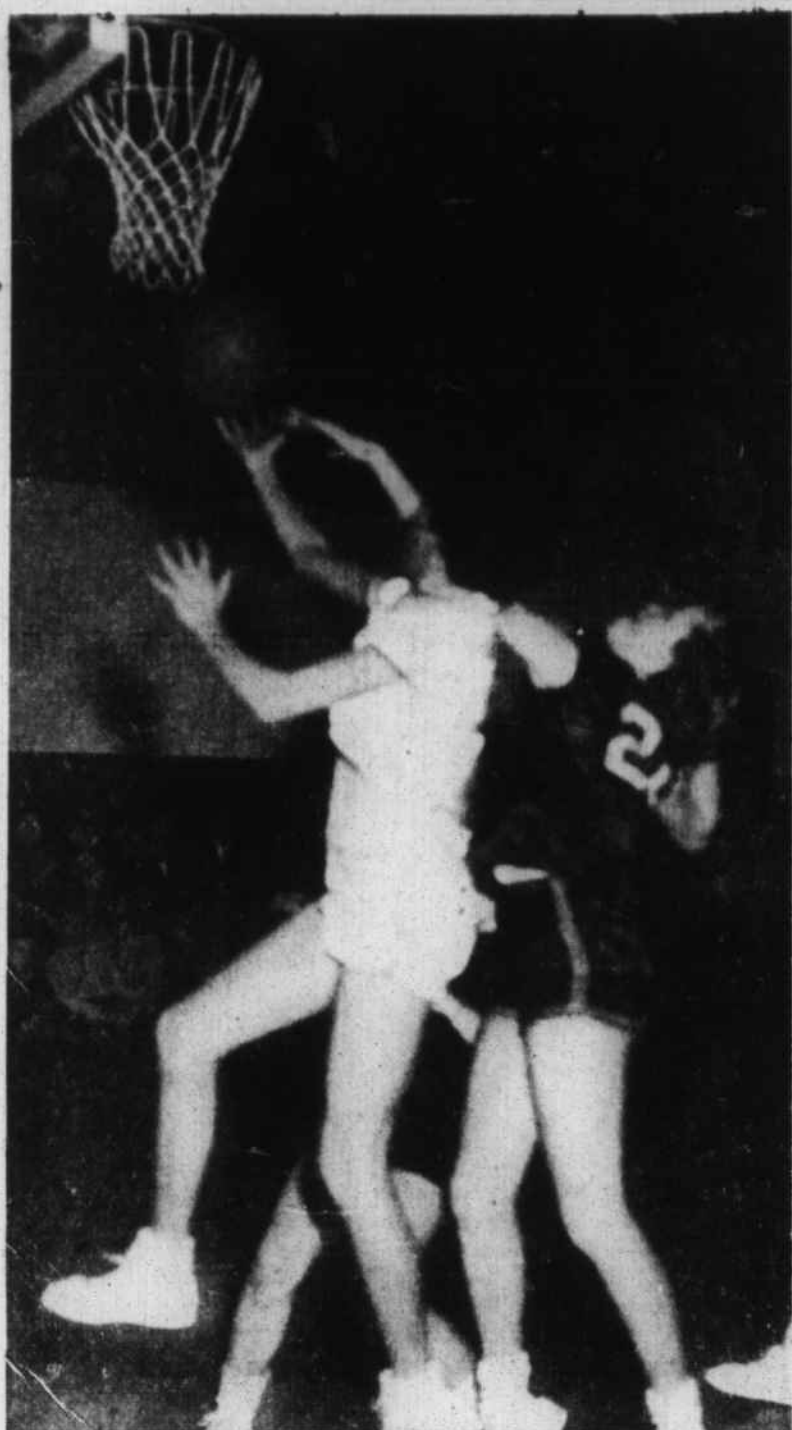

Waynesville Man Is On USS Mt. Olympus

Albert Crayne Jr., seaman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert D. Crayne of Waynesville, is serving aboard the command ship USS Mt. Olympus.

The Mt. Olympus participated in November in an amphibious force four day training operation, dubbed RonEx 11-54. It involved some 16 ships under the command of Rear Admiral Harold P. Smith.

Held in the Camp Pendleton-Little Creek, Va. area, the operation emphasized training in helicopter troop lifts, beach assaults, gunnery, communications and seamanship. It was designed to increase the efficiency of amphibious force personnel in the techniques of modern amphibious warfare.

Wheat's Grain Stocks Exceed Last Year's

Wheat stocks on North Carolina farms, as of January 1, were 9.4 per cent larger than on January 1, 1953. On-farm stocks of oats and corn were 58.6 and 8.3 per cent, respectively, larger than a year ago.

Smaller hay stocks are the result of a relatively short crop last year and increased feeding requirements to offset loss of roughage in drought-stricken pastures last summer and fall.
