Scripture—John 9.

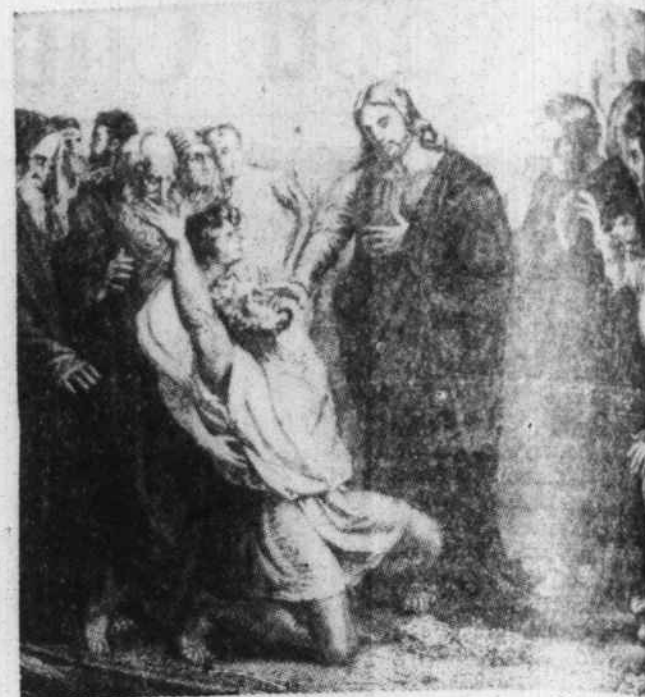
