Scripture—John 10.



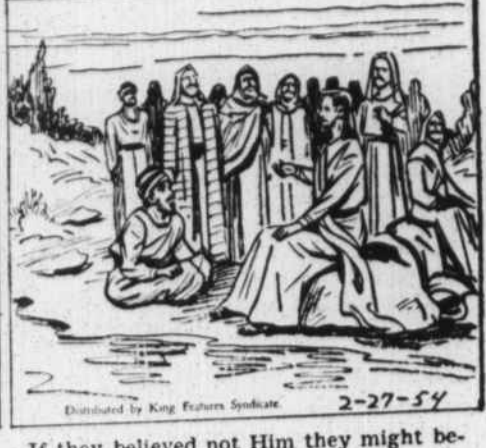
The good shepherd knows his sheep by name and they know his voice and will follow him when he leads them out to pasture. And he will lay down his life for his sheep, Jesus said.
