Lazarus, brother of Mary and Martha, Jesus' friends in Bethany, became sick, and the sisters sent word to Him, Christ did not go to him immediately but tarried where he was for two days. Then word came that Lazarus had died. Jesus told His disciples that they should go to the home of His friends in Bethany, saying, "Our friend Lazarus sleepeth; I go that I may awake him." Hearing that Jesus was coming, Martha went to meet Him. He told her, "Thy brother shall rise again. He that believeth in Me shall never die. Believest thou this?" Martha said, "You are Christ."

At the tomb the stone was rolled away, and Jesus called, "Lazarus, come forth!" "Then he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with grave clothes." MEMORY VERSE—John 11:25-26.

### Christians To Observe World Day Of Prayer
