Glenn Parris is a patient at Memorial Mission Hospital, Asheville, where he underwent surgery on his foot and ankle this week.

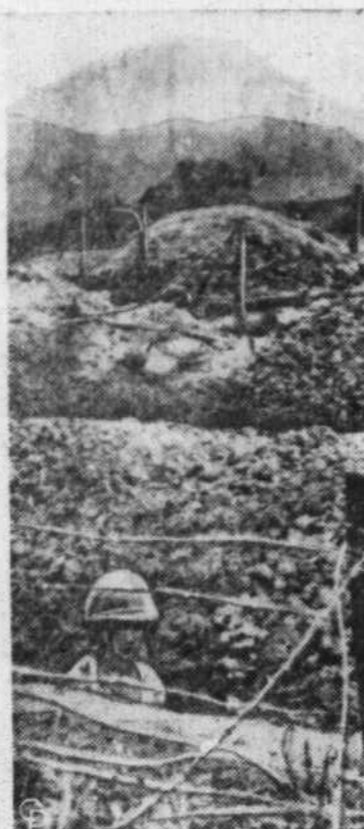
