### Ahijah Foresees a Divided Kingdom ILLUSTRATED SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON By Alfred J. Buescher

Scripture—1 Kings 11:1—12:24.



When Solomon was old he turned from the worship of Jehovah because his many wives were idol worshippers, and he became one. The Lord was angry and told the king that after his death the greater part of the kingdom would be taken away.

A young man named Jeroboam was "a mighty man of valor," and Solomon, seeing that he was industrious, gave him charge over the house of Joseph. But Jeroboam was not true to King Solomon, and he "lifted up his hand against the king."

Outside Jerusalem Jeroboam met the Prophet Ahijah. Ahijah was wearing a new garment, and he caught hold of it and tore it into 12 pieces. He gave 10 pieces to Jeroboam to keep, saying that they represented 10 tribes over which he would rule.

Solomon grew to hate Jeroboam and sought to kill him. He fled to Egypt, but when Solomon died, he returned. The people of the 10 tribes rebelled against Rehoboam's hard rule and made Jeroboam their king.

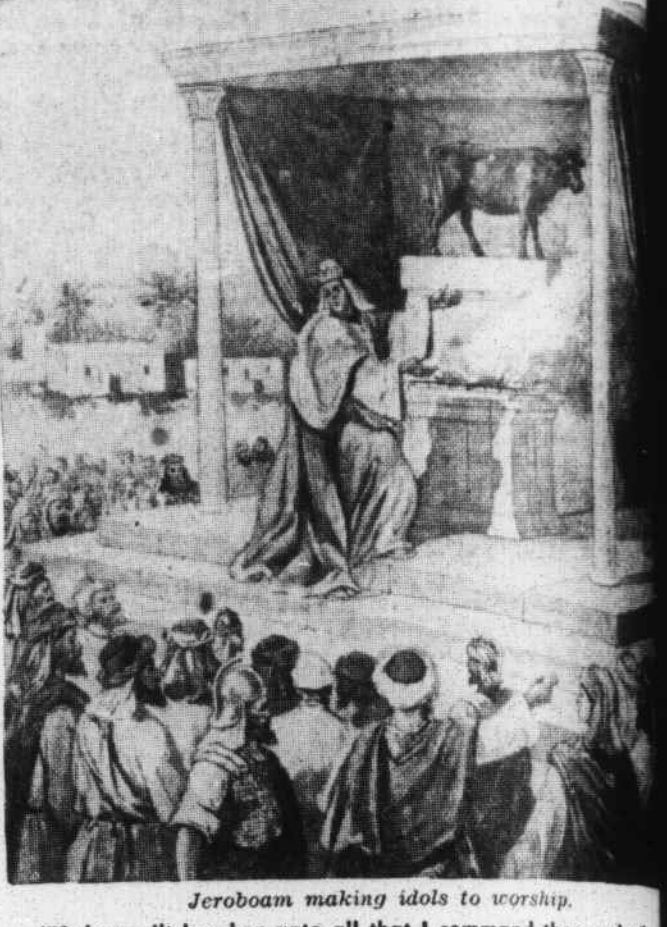

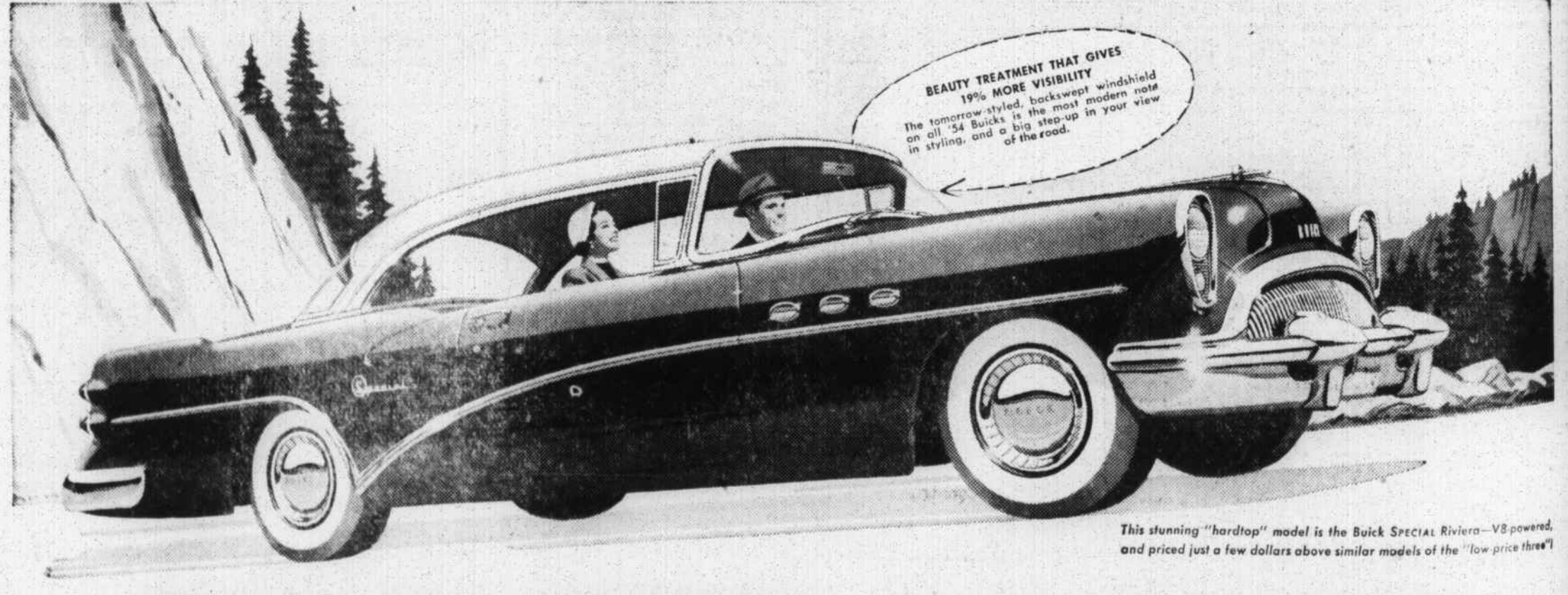
