BEEF STROGANOFF

- 2 lbs. ground beef
- 3 medium onions (diced fine)
- 2 medium dill pickles (diced fine)
- 2 cans mushroom soup (undiluted)
- 1/2 pt. sour cream
- 4 tsp. fat, or more if needed

In heavy skillet brown onions in fat, remove to use later. Place ground beef in fat and separate with fork, and keep turning until slightly browned. Return onions to beef mixture. Add diced dill pickles, and if moisture is needed to prevent sticking, use a little of the dill pickle juice. Add mushroom soup, mixing well. Allow to simmer for about 30 minutes. Just before serving fold in sour cream, but do not allow to boil. Serve on rye toast.
