## Sunday School Lesson

### Elijah Rebukes Ahab

PHET FORETELLS FEARFUL DEATH FOR THE KING AND HIS WICKED WIFE

Scripture—1 Kings 21.  
NEWMAN CAMPBELL  
CLOUDBESS seems at  
first a fault, not a crime.  
It is a fault, however, it may  
lead to murder, as in the  
case of King Ahab, who  
killed and abetted by  
his wife.  
"Thou shalt not covet," the  
Bible says. If we do find  
ourselves becoming envious  
of the possessions, there are  
ethical ways of attaining  
what we wish for. We may want  
something so much that we  
decide to save money to  
buy it. If it is an honor  
we can make ourselves  
of the honor, and so win  
it.  
Men often are envious of  
the possessions, but  
it is shown that the feel-  
ing and can often be led  
to share the playmate's  
happily with him. Our  
shows us to what dread-  
ful this fault of covetous-  
ness lead.  
The king of the northern  
kingdom, Israel, and close by his  
was a vineyard which the

clothes and "put sackcloth upon  
his flesh, and fasted, and lay in  
sackcloth and went softly."  
Then the word of the Lord  
came again to Elijah, saying:  
"Seest thou how Ahab humbled  
himself before Me? because he  
humbled himself before Me, I  
will not bring the evil in his days;  
but in his son's days will I bring  
the evil upon his house."  
So punishment for King Ahab's  
evil deeds was postponed for a  
time because of the Lord's good-  
ness.  
How few people, it seems, can  
be trusted not to misuse power.  
We have seen it happen in our  
own day. Adolf Hitler might have  
been a man for good in his  
country if he had chosen the right  
road. The Russian nation under  
a truly democratic leadership,  
might be an influence for peace  
and benevolence in the world, in-  
stead of using its powers to en-  
slave other nations and hold them  
in subjection.  
It is for us as individuals to  
help the world, even in small  
ways by rejoicing with those who  
do rejoice, and weeping with  
those who mourn. We can train  
ourselves to be unselfish, to follow  
Christ's teaching, to love our  
neighbors as ourselves. We will  
be much happier ourselves and  
help others to be so too.
