Kuykendall Hurls 2-Hitter; Hazelwood Topples Ecusta

Jim Kuykendall came through with a two-hitter Saturday against Ecusta and his Hazelwood mates celebrated by topping the Western Carolina Industrial League leaders, 5-3.

The victory was sweet revenge for a 9-0 shutout suffered by the locals at the hands of the Brevard team several weeks ago.

Kuykendall, Western Carolina pitching ace, fanned five and walked five.

Hazelwood collected eight hits off Ecusta hurler Jack Ammons — with Dee Stephenson and Lonnie Bishop each getting a pair of bingles.

Hazelwood picked up two runs in the second inning and another in the third. Two more came in the seventh as Bishop singled to left and advanced on Stephenson's single. Yount sacrificed, advancing both runners and Blalock was intentionally passed, loading the bases. With a full count, Elmer Dudley singled to center field, scoring Bishop and Stephenson.

In defensive play, Stephenson and Troutman were outstanding.

Its victory put Hazelwood into a three-way tie for first place with Ecusta and Enka.

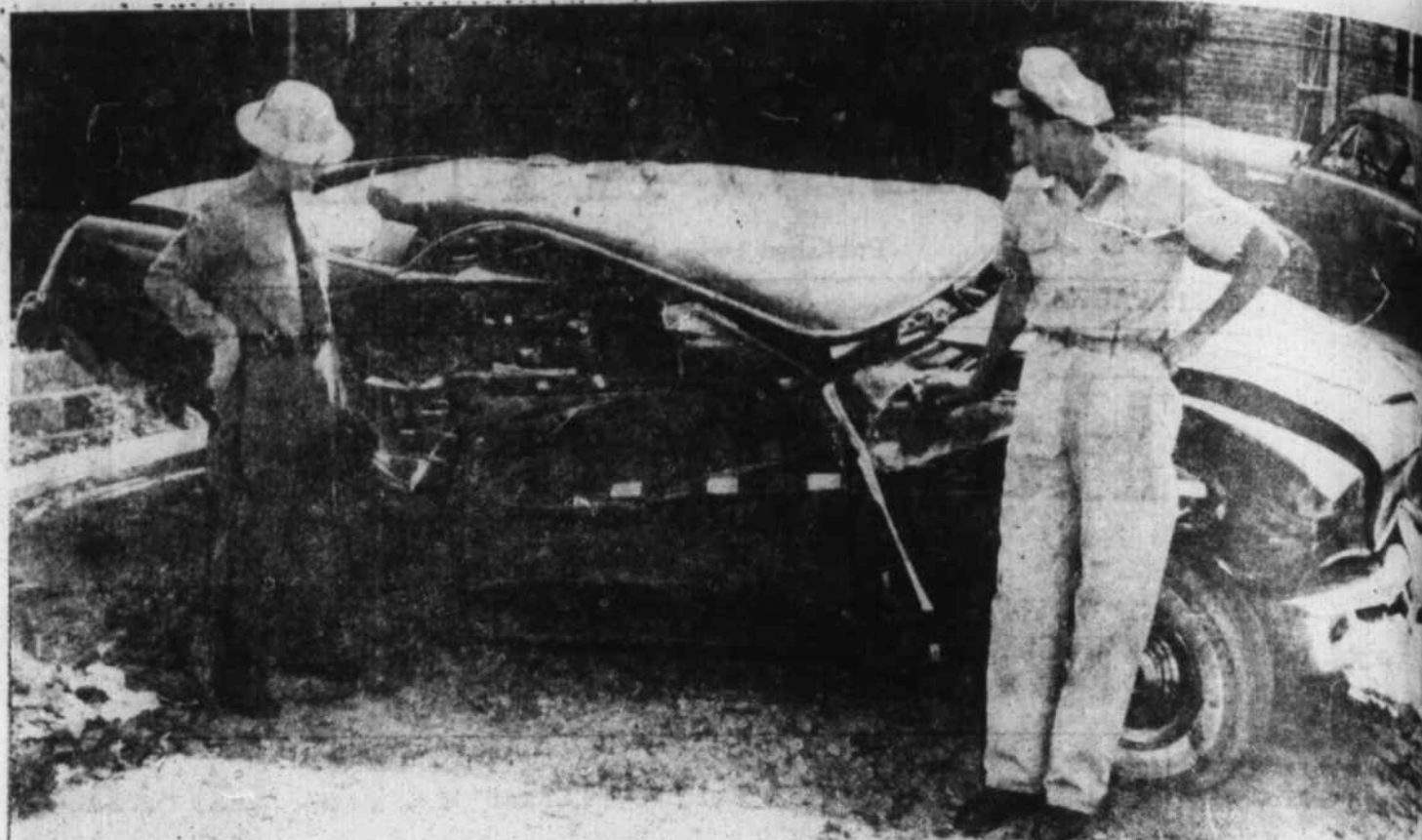
The team was picked upon recommendations of over 20 coaches in all sections of the state.

Fontana Among Lakes Stocked With Walleyes

In conclusion of a program planned to introduce walleyed pike in such of the Catawba and Yadkin reservoirs as appeared to provide suitable habitat, the Fish Division, N. C. Wildlife Resources Commission, has stocked walleye fry in Lake Hickory and Lake Rhodhiss. The fry used in the stocking were hatched at Table Rock Hatchery from a shipment of five million eggs obtained from New York.

Walleye stocking was begun several years ago by the Fish Division to improve fishing in reservoirs having a fluctuating water level. Bass lay their eggs in beds in shallow water. If the water level drops a few feet during the hatching period, many egg beds will be out of the water and a year's crop of bass will be lost. Power reservoirs often have a daily fluctuation in the water level which, coupled with the seasonal fluctuation, assures poor fishing for species that spawn in shallow, still water.

Since the walleye is a native of cool waters such as are found in Western North Carolina, and lays its eggs in adhesive strings in tributary streams flowing over rocky bottoms, officials of the Fish Division decided to try stocking them in some of the cool water lakes where the bass fishing could not be improved. Two years after the first successful stocking, 16-18 inch walleyes appeared in the fisherman's catch. In some places the fishing take has been doubled by the introduction of the walleye species.

Lakes which have been stocked with walleye are: Chatuge, Fontana, Hickory, Rhodhiss, James and Hiwassee Dam Reservoir.

North Carolina commercial chick hatcheries produced 5.95 million chicks during January, 1954, an increase of 17 per cent over hatchings a year earlier.

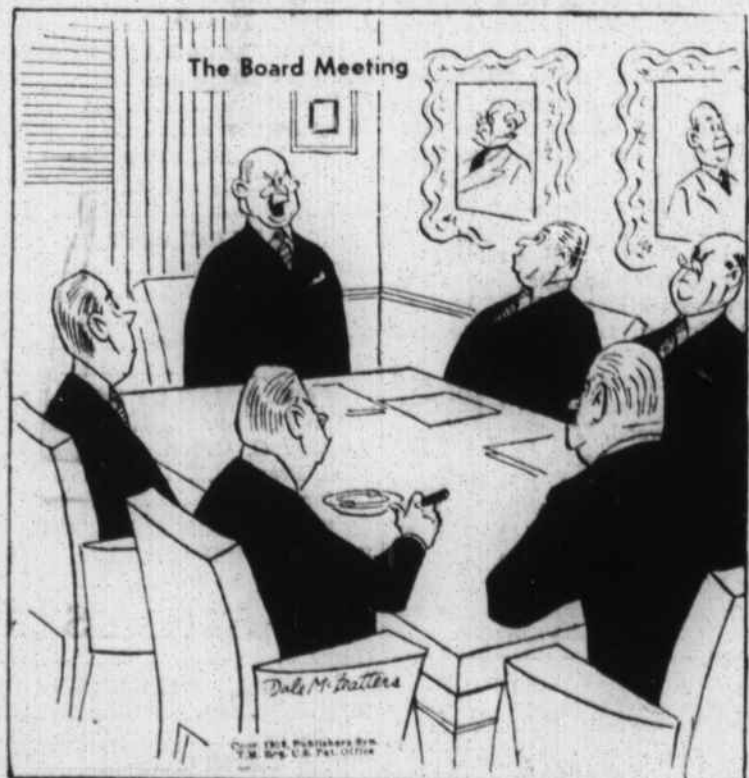
