Chief contender and the possible favorite will be Mrs. Estelle Lawson Page of Chapel Hill, who won the championship in 1950, 1951, and 1952, but did not participate last-year because of illness.

"Early birds" here next Saturday will find the course open for practice. On Sunday some 200 are expected to participate in the Scotch foursome event, in which prizes will be awarded. Also scheduled that day are a reception at. the Country Club, and a drawing for a woman's diamond wristwatch.


