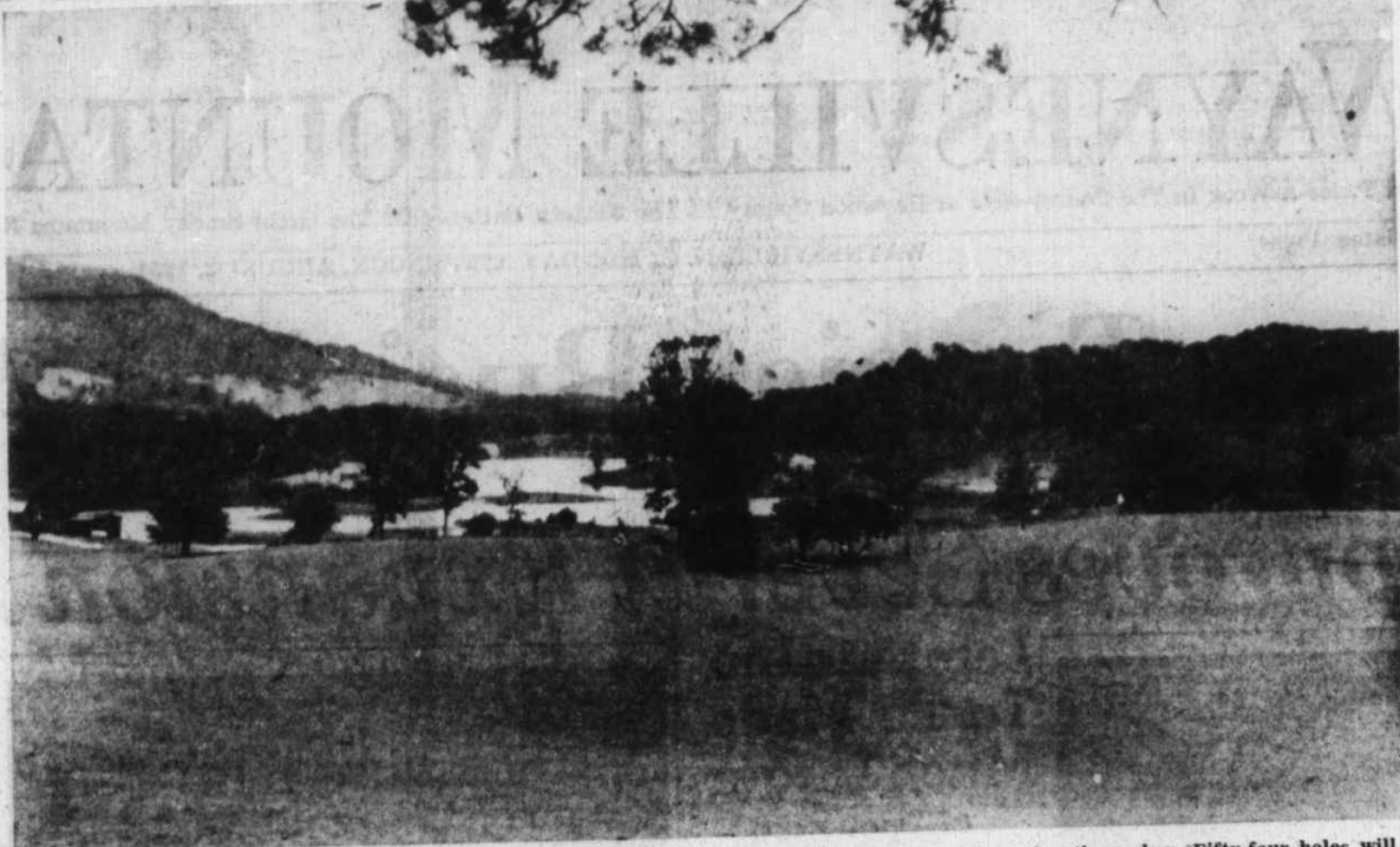

Western Region finals, matching winners of the three districts, will be held in Canton Thursday and Friday.

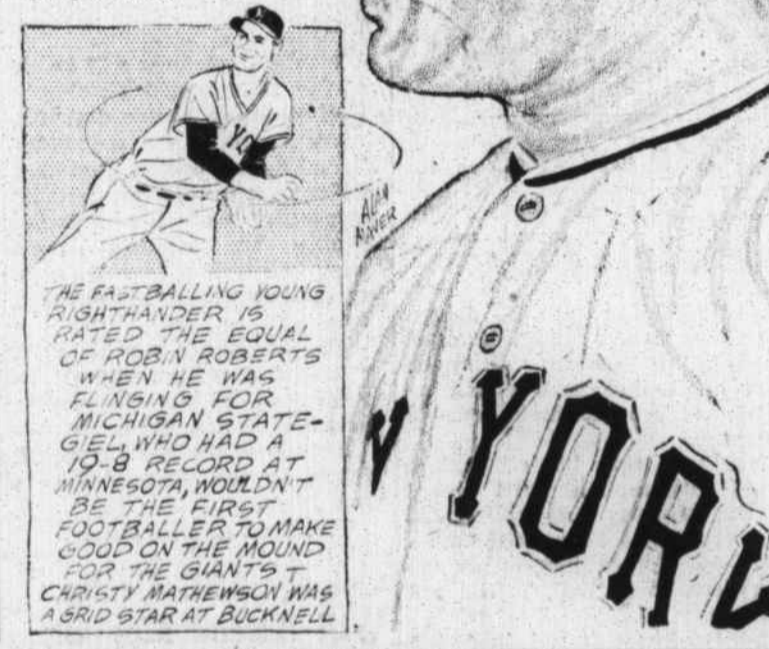
Jack Justice of Canton is commissioner for the Western District, while German Miller of Canton is director of District 3.

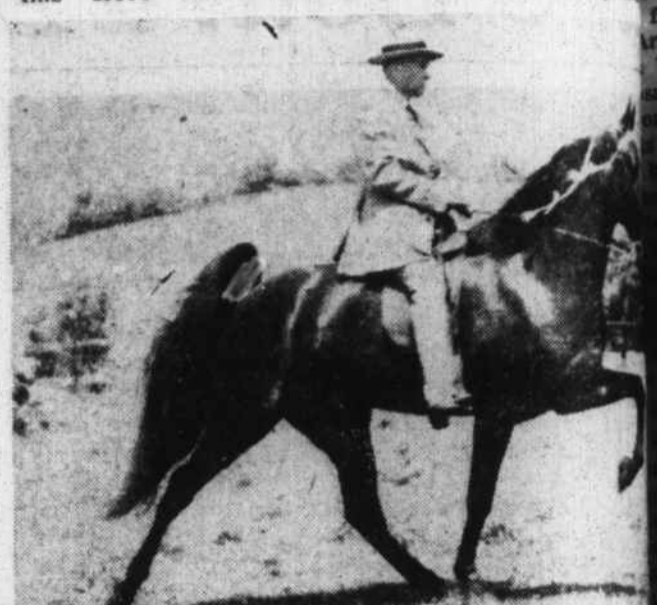

Tennessee Walking Horse

ARTICLE V

The true breed is the Tennessee Walking Horse and the registry is the Tennessee Walking Horse Breeders Association of America at Lewisburg, Tennessee. This horse was developed as a breed in 1951 was accepted by the United States Government Bureau of Animal Husbandry as a distinct breed. The foundation sire is Allen F. Crossed with the native mares of Tennessee, which contained a mixture of both hot and cold blood, this breed was established—a sensible animal

utility and pleasure horse—now highly specialized as a show ring performer. The walking horse has and is shown at three-gaits—the flat foot walk, canter and running walk. He is judged on the basis of 20% flat foot, 20% canter, 20% conformation and 40% running walk. The flat foot walk is a diagonally-opposed movement of the feet, each foot coming down straight and flat from all four corners in the following manner: right front foot and left rear, and vice versa, in a respectively timed one-two-three-four measure.
