Park Officials Seek **To Improve Fishing**





The annual Western North Carolina Swim Meet, sponsored by the Asheville Javcees, will be held at Recreation Park Friday at 1 p.m. it has been announced.

Contestants will be divided into four classes: midget (14 and under), junior (16 and under), senior (18 and under), and open.

In the midget and junior classes three events will be held: 35-vard free style. 35-vard back stroke; and 35-vard breast stroke. In the senior division (men only) each of the events will be for 70 vards. The men's onen class includes the free style back stroke, and breast stroke for 70 vards, a 105-medley relay, and a 140-yard free style relay.

In the diving events entrants will be divided into two classes: those 16 and under and those over 16. A front dive will be required: four dives are ontional.
