Swim Meet Set Friday At Asheville

The annual Western North Carolina Swim Meet, sponsored by the Asheville Jayvees, will be held at Recreation Park Friday at 1 p.m., it has been announced.

Contestants will be divided into four classes: midet (14 and under), junior (16 and under), senior (18 and under), and open.

In the midet and junior classes, three events will be held: 35-yard free style, 35-yard back stroke, and 25-yard breast stroke. In the senior division (men only) each of the events will be for 70 yards. The men's open class includes the free style, back stroke, and breast stroke for 70 yards, a 105-medley relay, and a 140-yard free style relay.

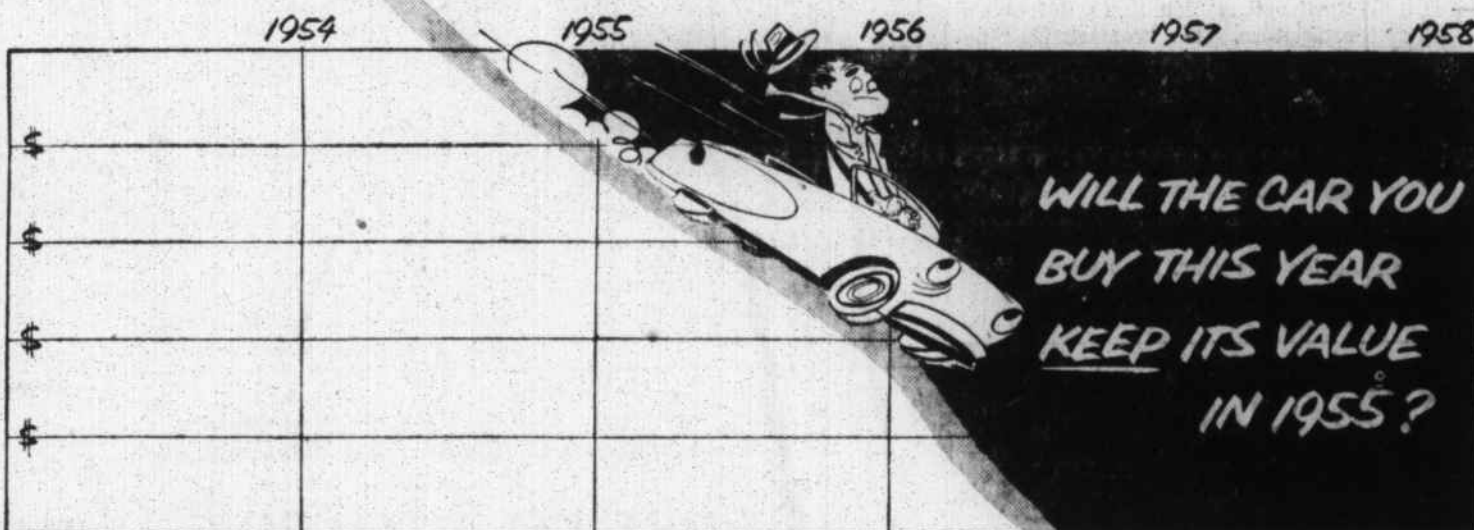
In the diving events entrants will be divided into two classes: those 16 and under and those over 16. A front dive will be required; four dives are optional.

According to the Jayvees, the objectives of the swim meet are twofold: (1) development of overall water safety through participation and observation of advanced swim techniques, and (2) development of increased aquatic skill to enable the youth of this region to better participate in an increasingly popular collegiate sport.

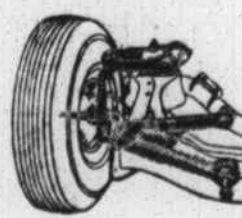
