**ILLUSTRATED SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON**

Scripture—Acts 20:35; I Corinthians 16:1-2; II Corinthians 8:1-9.



Paul met the Ephesian elders on the seacoast as he was about to sail for Jerusalem. He told them he probably would never see them again, and to remember Jesus' words, "It is better to give than to receive."



The Christians in Jerusalem were in dire need, so Paul suggested to the Corinthians that on the first day of each week each one should lay aside, "as God hath prospered him," for the relief of the saints.



Although the churches in Macedonia were also very poor, they contributed more than generously to the suffering brethren in Jerusalem. Paul, disappointed with the offerings of the Corinthians, wrote them of this liberality.



The Macedonians also begged Paul to take their gifts to Jerusalem and minister to the saints himself, he wrote. "But first gave their own selves to the Lord."

**Bible Words for Today**

JOHN 4:17—"Whoever knows what is right to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin." (RSV)

This passage has two aspects; an implied positive and a certain negative.

Only those who have a certain amount of knowledge relative to right and wrong need apply the passage to themselves. This, almost certainly, includes all those sufficiently literate to read this feature. These words of St. James refer to what we sometimes call the sins of omission—which are legion.

To seek knowledge is good; to apply knowledge is better. To seek God's will for our lives is necessary; to do God's will is imperative. The latter calls for more dedication and self discipline than the former.

Most of us know more about the good life than we ever achieve. Our practice of Christian principles and ethics falls far short of our understanding of them. To increase knowledge is relatively easy; to improve conduct is difficult. Ignorance of the law does not excuse us before men; ignoring the law indicts us before God.

The best way of honoring God is to believe His word, as revealed in the Scripture; to trust His Grace as manifested by the Son and to act upon the knowledge that has been imparted to us by the Holy Spirit. To do otherwise is to sin.
